
Southeastern Highlands

General Summary for Friday, 26 April, 2024



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 26 April, 2024

Light winds but cool or cold feeling across the UK. Any morning cloud will break and lift above summits, but may temporarily re-form during any afternoon showers. Showers on high ground will fall as snow flurries or hail in many regions. Patchwork of sunshine.

Afternoon showers, falling as snow or hail on high ground

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 26 April, 2024

How windy? (On the Munros)	Light winds up to 10 to 15mph, most often northeasterly but may be variable in direction at times.		
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small		
How wet?	Showers, most frequent afternoon		
(Precipitation and its impact)	Occasional showers, getting more frequent for a time in the afternoon. Will fall as sleety snow or hail on high ground. Small risk of lightning.		
Cloud on the hills?	Lifting above most tops		
	Patches of cloud on higher slopes, especially during and after showers. Base rising towards or above highest tops.		
Chance of cloud free Munros?	70%		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sunshine in morning will give way to mostly overcast skies in afternoon. Excellent visibility.		
How Cold? (at 900m)	-3C in morning rising to 3C. At times, feeling around -5C in the wind.		
Freezing Level	As low as 500m in morning, especially central Highlands. Frost many glens at dawn. Rising to 1200m mid-afternoon onwards. Eastern areas may only rise to 800m.

How wet?	Afternoon showers becoming widespread	Risk of snow/hail flurries
(Precipitation and its impact)	Mostly dry morning with the odd shower possible. Showers building and becoming widespread in the afternoon, falling as sleet or snow on high ground. Small risk of lightning.	Mostly dry but risk of light snow or hail flurries.
Cloud on the hills?	Morning cloud breaking. Patchy in afternoon.	Morning cloud, breaking and lifting
	Some summits shrouded at first, mostly breaking up by late morning. Patchy cloud re-forming in the afternoon, especially during and after showers.	Areas of widespread cloud shrouding higher slopes and summits in morning. Will lift and break through the day, clearing most summits.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	60%	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Weak sunshine though high-level cloud in the morning. Becoming brighter but more patchy in afternoon as shower clouds form well above the summits. Good or excellent visibility.	Patchy sunshine developing. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	-2C in the morning. Rising to 2C around midday.	As cold as -2C in the morning. Rising to 2 to 4C, warmest near Lochs Tay and Rannoch.
Freezing Level	Pockets as low as 600m in the morning. Rising to 1100 to 1200m by evening.	900m in the morning, rising to above most or all summits through the day.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 27 April, 2024

Cool and intermittently showery weather with mostly light winds over the weekend and the early part of next week. Small chance of a small region of low pressure bringing heavy rain on Sunday, but it is increasingly likely this will be over the North Sea. Indications of drier and slightly warmer weather from mid-week onwards.
