
# Southeastern Highlands

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## General Summary for Tuesday, 7 May, 2024



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 7 May, 2024

High pressure extends in from the west, but remnants of previous showers leave a zone of low cloud and drizzly rain over central Scotland which may linger. Local showers forming. Brighter but rather cool for the northern Highlands. Fairly cloudy England & Wales, isolated showers. Light winds overall.

## **Headline for Southeastern Highlands**

Cloudy, dull and drizzly; slow improvement, risk a shower.

## Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 7 May, 2024

How windy? (On the Munros)	Variable 5-10mph or less.	
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small	
How wet?	Drizzly, risk showers afternoon	
(Precipitation and its impact)	Patchy drizzly rain in the morning, locally damp for a few hours central areas, tending to fade out.

Effect of wind on you?	Feeling increasingly breezy, may start to affect comfortable walking on exposed tops.	Fairly small
How wet?	Rain unlikely	Little or no rain
(Precipitation and its impact)		Risk of a little light rain or drizzle overnight and into morning, fading out. Chance of an isolated afternoon shower.
Cloud on the hills?	Many tops clearing	Mostly central areas, lifting
	Banks of cloud around some slopes in the morning, plus local mist some glens at first. Lifting toward higher tops with breaks forming to most summits. Lowering cloud may spill into central highlands later.	Covering higher terrain most extensively in central Highlands in the morning, patchier over tops east of the A9. Cloud bases tending to lift and break toward many tops.

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun, some high cloud builds from west, thickening later. Visibility very good.	Glimpses of sun through high cloud. Visibility mostly good.

### **Planning Outlook**

## All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 8 May, 2024

High pressure is nearby during the week ahead, but weak fronts drifting in from the Atlantic on southwesterly winds bring periods of rain and drizzle to western Scotland - the mountains often covered in cloud here. Drier with higher cloud bases toward the central and eastern Highlands. England and Wales mostly dry, isolated showers, hills often clear, light winds and mild or increasingly warm. Dry and warm for much of Britain to start the weekend with southerly breezes, but a greater risk of some rain or showers by Sunday. Showery conditions more likely into the start of next week with lower pressure likely.

#### Forecast issued at 16:30 on Monday, 6 May, 2024
