


# Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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## General Summary for Tuesday, 7 May, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 7 May, 2024

High pressure extends in from the west, but remnants of previous showers leave a zone of low cloud and drizzly rain over central Scotland which may linger. Local showers forming. Brighter but rather cool for the northern Highlands. Fairly cloudy England & Wales, isolated showers. Light winds overall.

#### Headline for Brecon Beacons

Varied cloud and sun, isolated showers forming later.

## Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 7 May, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northeasterly 10 to 15mph in the morning, becoming variable 5 to 10mph or less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Local showers forming afternoon</b> Largely dry morning, fine drizzle if in cloud. Localised showers forming into the afternoon, an isolated heavier one later.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Lifting above tops</b> Patchy cloud on some slopes and fog some valleys at first. Will lift and break above most or all tops into middle of day and afternoon.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>70% rising to 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Varied cloud and occasional sun, becoming sunniest toward west coast during afternoon. Misty start, visibility improving to become good.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	8 to 10C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Clearing tops</b>  Patchy cloud around some slopes, plus local mist some valleys at first. Lifting and breaking above higher tops.	<b>Little if any</b>  Brief fragments around higher slopes in the morning, but soon dispersing.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>80%</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun. Visibility very good.	Patchwork of sun and thin high cloud. Visibility very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	8 to 10C.	9 to 11C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits	Above the summits

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 8 May, 2024**

High pressure is nearby during the week ahead, but weak fronts drifting in from the Atlantic on southwesterly winds bring periods of rain and drizzle to western Scotland - the mountains often covered in cloud here. Drier with higher cloud bases toward the central and eastern Highlands. England and Wales mostly dry, isolated showers, hills often clear, light winds and mild or increasingly warm. Dry and warm for much of Britain to start the weekend with southerly breezes, but a greater risk of some rain or showers by Sunday. Showery conditions more likely into the start of next week with lower pressure likely.
