

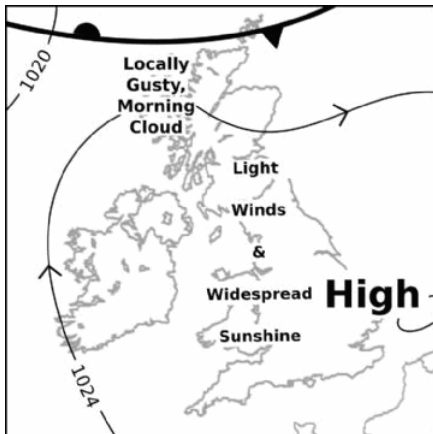
# Brecon Beacons

## General Summary for Friday, 10 May, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 10 May, 2024

Extensively dry across much of the country with any morning cloud, if any, soon evaporating. Light winds except in the West and Northwest Highlands, where it will be locally gusty. Widespread sunshine developing through high cloud; summits feeling mild.

Widespread sunshine and mostly light winds

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 10 May, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South 10 to 20mph, strongest toward the west.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	Rain not expected
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	Hills clear
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	Almost certain.
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Mostly sunny and thin high clouds. Slight haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	11 to 13C. Feeling as cold as 5C in the wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Saturday 11 May	Sunday 12 May
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Southerly 10 to 20mph.  <b>Small.</b>	Southerly 10 to 15mph, stronger during gusts. Beware powerful gusts before thundery afternoon showers. <b>Balance affected during gusts.</b> <b>In the afternoon, powerful gusts before showers may knock you off balance.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain unlikely.</b>	<b>Increasing risk of localised thunderstorms.</b> Spots of rain falling from high level cloud from morning. Increasing risk of local showers and possibly even torrential thunderstorms by late afternoon, especially mid-Wales. Persistent rain overnight as front moves in from evening.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>   <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Hills mostly clear</b>  Chance of fog in the valleys and on the lower hills at dawn.  <b>90%</b>	<b>Most mountains clear until rain forms</b>  A few patches of mist in the morning, including in the valleys. During heavier showers, cloud will soon envelop higher ground and mid-slopes for a time.  <b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny, but hazy. Fair-weather clouds building up in the afternoon.	Pockets of sunshine fading as high cloud thickens through day. Hazy or very hazy in morning. Haze mostly washed out by afternoon showers.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	12 to 14C. Feeling as cold as 5C at times in the wind, especially when not in direct sunshine.  Above the summits.	11 to 14C, warmest in eastern areas. Feeling 5 to 10C in the wind.  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 11 May, 2024

High pressure drifting eastwards during the weekend, whilst southerly breezes brings warmer air and often clear skies, with most places staying dry. A greater risk of showers or thunderstorms by Sunday. Low pressure bringing wet and windier weather for a day or two Monday onwards. Becoming showery from Tuesday or Wednesday with varying cloud banks across many mountain areas. Temperatures remaining mild.

### Forecast issued at 16:30 on Thursday, 9 May, 2024
