
# The Northwest Highlands

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## General Summary for Thursday, 25 April, 2024



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 25 April, 2024

Cold day across the UK with many areas having northerly winds. Increasing risk of showers in the afternoon in all areas, falling as snow or hail on high ground. Many summits clear or soon clear except for fragments of cloud forming during showers, particularly in the afternoon.

### Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 25 April, 2024

How windy? (On the Munros)	Northerly 15 to 20mph, at times 25mph some exposed tops. Tending to ease a little in the afternoon.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small effect on walking, but continued notable wind chill on hills.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers developing A scattering of showers forming increasingly during the day and especially mid-afternoon. Hail, plus snow flurries at times falling to mid-heights.	
Cloud on the hills?  Chance of cloud free Munros?	Occasionally on higher areas  Patches of cloud forming over some slopes in the morning, bases lifting toward the summits and many mountains will clear. Local fragments returning around showers.  70%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Variable cloud and sun, best in morning. Visibility excellent.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	-3C rising to 0 or +1C. Wind chill feeling like -5 to -10C, coldest in morning.	
Freezing Level	600 to 800m, lowest in north in morning, frost some glens; rising toward 900m, locally 1000m+ near Kintail into afternoon.

How wet?	Risk of showers	Afternoon showers becoming widespread
(Precipitation and its impact)	Occasional showers, getting more frequent for a time in the afternoon. Will fall as sleety snow or hail on high ground.	Mostly dry morning with the odd shower possible. Showers building and becoming widespread in the afternoon, falling as sleet or snow on high ground.
Cloud on the hills?	Lifting above most tops	Morning cloud breaking. Patchy in afternoon.
	Patches of cloud on higher slopes, especially during and after showers. Base rising towards or above highest tops.	Many summits shrouded in the morning, especially well inland. Mostly breaking up by late morning. Patchy cloud re-forming in the afternoon, especially during and after showers.

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Widespread sunshine near west coast in morning will become more patchy in the afternoon. Overcast inland. Excellent visibility.	Weak sunshine though high-level cloud in the morning. Becoming brighter but more patchy in afternoon as shower clouds form. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	-1C in morning rising to around 2 to 3C late afternoon. Feeling -5C or below on Skye.	-2C in the morning. Rising to 2C by the afternoon.
Freezing Level	700m in morning rising to 900 to 1000m mid-afternoon onwards, highest in Kintail. Frost many glens at dawn.	700 to 800m in the morning, rising to 1100m by evening. Lowest in Sutherland.

## **Planning Outlook**

## All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 26 April, 2024

Remaining cold, especially northern England and Scotland. Initially winds remaining light but showers increasingly likely, falling as snow or hail on high ground. Small but active low bringing wind and precipitation to England and Wales on Sunday. Remaining showery and on-and-off cold into the early part of next week.
