

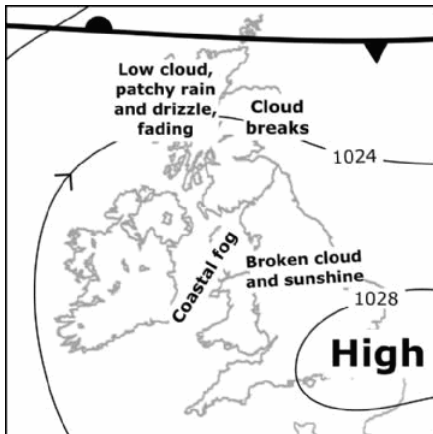

## General Summary for Thursday, 9 May, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 9 May, 2024**

Scottish west coast may see some denser clouds and rain patches in the first half of the day, while SW winds weaken gradually. Throughout the day conditions improve, bringing some sunshine to most mountains, perhaps excluding western coastal tops. Fine weather with just some clouds in England and Wales.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Pleasantly warm mix of more sun and less clouds.

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 9 May, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	West or southwesterly 10 to 15mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	Rain not expected
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little if any</b> Brief fragments around higher slopes in the morning, but soon dispersing. Local coastal fog in the morning.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun and thin high cloud. Visibility very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	8 to 10C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

	Friday 10 May	Saturday 11 May
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	South 15 to 25mph, strongest on western summits toward Llyn Peninsula in the afternoon. <b>Mostly fairly small, may affect walking and balance on the highest ridges.</b>	Southeasterly 10 to 20mph. <b>Small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain not expected.</b>	<b>Remote risk of local showers afternoon.</b> Mostly dry, in the afternoon low chance of isolated showers around Yr Wyddfa/Snowdon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills clear.</b>	<b>Hills mostly clear.</b>  Patches of fog in the valleys at dawn.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Almost certain.</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny and thin high clouds. Slight haze.	Mostly sunny, but hazy. Clouds building up in the afternoon.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b> <b>Freezing Level</b>	10 to 12C.  Above the summits.	10 to 12C.  Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 10 May, 2024**

High pressure drifting eastwards during the weekend, whilst southerly breezes brings warmer air and often clear skies, with most places staying dry. A greater risk of some rain or showers by Sunday in the west. Low pressure then moving toward the south of Britain by early next week is likely to strengthen the winds and may bring some rain or showers for a time.
