

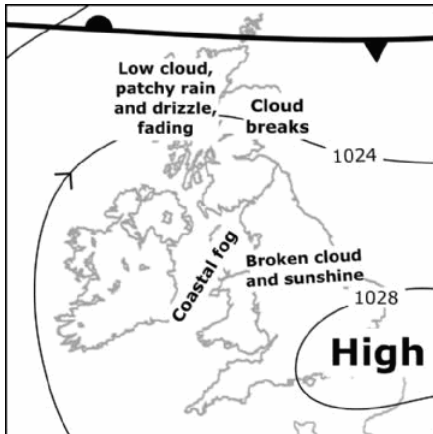
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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## General Summary for Thursday, 9 May, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 9 May, 2024**

Scottish west coast may see some denser clouds and rain patches in the first half of the day, while SW winds weaken gradually. Throughout the day conditions improve, bringing some sunshine to most mountains, perhaps excluding western coastal tops. Fine weather with just some clouds in England and Wales.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Mix of clouds and sun.

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 9 May, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	West or southwesterly 15 to 25mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Little or no rain</b> Risk of a little light rain or drizzle overnight and into morning, fading out. Chance of an isolated afternoon shower on the Angus Hills and eastward.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Mostly central areas, lifting</b> Covering higher terrain most extensively in central Highlands in the morning, patchier over tops east of the A9. Cloud bases tending to lift and break toward many tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Glimpses of sun through high cloud. Visibility mostly good.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	7 to 10C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

**Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead**

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	South to southwesterly 10 to 20mph.	Southerly 10 to 20mph, occasionally 25mph on highest exposed tops in the afternoon.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small.</b>	<b>Fairly small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain unlikely.</b>	<b>Low risk showers late afternoon.</b> Mostly dry. Low possibility of showers reaching from the south in late afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills mostly clear.</b>  Rare if any fragments.	<b>Hills clear.</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>95%</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunny at the start, patches of clouds developing in the afternoon. Good visibility.	Sunny start, patches of clouds building up in the afternoon. Good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	9 to 11C.	10 to 13C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 10 May, 2024**

High pressure drifting eastwards during the weekend, whilst southerly breezes brings warmer air and often clear skies, with most places staying dry. A greater risk of some rain or showers by Sunday in the west. Low pressure then moving toward the south of Britain by early next week is likely to strengthen the winds and may bring some rain or showers for a time.
