

Continuing cold with higher areas below freezing point, particularly in the morning. Showers, mostly hail flurries developing, becoming frequent NW Scotland. Noticeable wind chill Wales. Very clear air.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 27 April, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 10mph, perhaps 15mph Yorkshire.	
Effect of wind on you?	Small.	
How wet?	A few hail flurries	
(Precipitation and its impact)	A few hail flurries mainly mid to late morning onwards.	
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any	
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bright sunshine at times, although cloud filling in for periods. Excellent or superb visibility.	
How Cold? (at 700m)	Close to freezing point after dawn. Reaching as high as 6C in the afternoon.	
And in the valleys	Widespread slight frost at dawn; peaking at around 11C early to mid afternoon.

How Cold? (at 700m)	0C after dawn but will tend to rise toward 4C by mid afternoon.	3C rising to 6C.
And in the valleys	Ground frost in places at dawn. By mid afternoon, typically 9 to 11C.	Ground frost some valleys at dawn; will reach around 13C in the afternoon.

## All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 28 April, 2024

Less cold next week with freezing levels almost constantly above highest summits. Rain from time to time, particularly across Wales. Wind direction will be predominantly easterly. This will bring in frequent low cloud to more eastern mountains, with highest cloud base often near the west coast.
