


Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales, including highest point in Preseli Hills.



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General Summary for Sunday, 21 April, 2019



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 21 April, 2019

Another warm day with strong sunshine for England & Wales. Dry for much of Scotland too. Toward the W/NW Highlands, a front grazing the coast brings some low cloud, and occasional bursts of rain. Strongest winds also NW Scotland, up to gale force locally.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Strong sunshine. Breeze fairly light.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 21 April, 2019

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly, 5-10mph morning, tending to increase a little, to around 15mph afternoon, perhaps 20mph western hills by evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills generally clear Patches of low cloud on some slopes, or areas of valley mist at dawn, but these all breaking up by mid morning. Then widely clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon almost certain.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely sunny. Visibility generally good or very good; slight haze.
How Cold? (at 750m)	11C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Monday 22 April	Tuesday 23 April
How windy? (On the summits)	South to southeasterly 20-30mph.	East to southeasterly 15-20mph, perhaps locally 25-30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, but fairly gusty at times with local buffeting; especially in afternoon showers.	Fairly small, but locally blustery, gusty to lower slopes.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Dry morning, risk of afternoon showers. After a dry morning, increasing risk of scattered thundery showers developing in the afternoon.	Chance an afternoon shower Possible patches of drizzly rain locally at dawn, fading. By afternoon, a chance of isolated heavy showers popping up, most likely toward west.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little Isolated pockets of low cloud some eastern slopes around dawn and again perhaps across higher tops in the afternoon during showers. Otherwise, hills clear.	Mostly very little Patches of cloud may cling to some slopes from dawn, generally breaking up, but reforming if showers develop.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine, but cloud bubbling up in the afternoon as showers develop. A general haze.	Fairly sunny, but sometimes obscured by high level cloud. Distant visibility reduced by haze.
How Cold? (at 750m)	11C	11 to 13C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 22 April, 2019**

Warm southeasterly winds to begin the week, with most places staying dry early in the week; blustery in places, locally E-SE'ly gales, with strong gusts to some lower slopes. By Wednesday and Thursday, as low pressure encroaches in from the west, there is an increasing risk of heavy, thundery bursts of rain breaking out, these initially focused on England & Wales, then likely advancing north into Scotland. Cooler and mixed into next weekend, with some rain or showers. Indications toward the very end of April suggest a chillier northerly flow may well develop.
