


Brecon Beacons

General Summary for Wednesday, 11 September, 2019



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 September, 2019

A weakening cold front clears southwards; early rain fading from the Lakes & Pennines; slower to clear across Wales. For the Highlands, rain on and off in western areas through the day, with smaller amounts in the east. A windy day, although gales tending to ease, except in N Scotland.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Windy, gales at first; occasional rain/drizzle clearing afternoon.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 11 September, 2019

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly, 40-45mph for a few hours from dawn, easing gradually to 30mph into middle of day, or 20-25mph later afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Blustery across the hills; buffeting in morning and notable wind chill higher tops. Easing afternoon.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Occasional rain; lair dry. Rain and drizzle now and again; very little east Wales. Will become isolated or clear completely from north through afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive many hours Shrouding most hills from lower slopes up in morning. Whilst rain persists, cloud staying extensive across hills. Bases tending to lift from north afternoon, to 600m west Wales, but 800m east Wales.
Chance of cloud free summits?	10% rising to 40%, later 70% east.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Brief glimpses of sun into afternoon, mostly above eastern valleys. Visibility poor at first, improving slowly, although a general haze, particularly in west.
How Cold? (at 750m)	Around 8C, but early morning a degree or so higher. Where exposed to wind on tops in morning, feeling close to 0C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.
