


Brecon Beacons

General Summary for Thursday, 12 September, 2019



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 September, 2019

Strong winds, rain and copious low cloud will accompany a wave on a front that will run northeast across Britain. Northern Scotland will be north of this - although still blustery with showers.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Windy. Extensive low cloud; occasional rain.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 12 September, 2019

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest later veering westerly; between 30 and occasionally 40mph .
Effect of wind on you?	Walking arduous for periods on higher areas.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain or drizzle mainly western hills Drizzle and rain now and again, probably more frequent for an for or two into the afternoon. In east Wales (north from the Black Mountains) substantially dry: total rainfall very small.
Cloud on the hills?	Most summits persistently foggy Fog will shroud most areas all day, although a rise in cloud base for a few hours. Overall, expect fog on most summits above 500m, sometimes 300m west and southernmost slopes. However, cloud often confined above 600m east Wales.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine rarely valleys east Wales. Visibility often good, although a haze, and will deteriorate further in rain.
How Cold? (at 750m)	14C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly or variable, 5-10mph or less.	Southerly 10mph to perhaps later 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.	Mostly negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected No rain	No rain
Cloud on the hills?	Not expected	Very little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sun. Visibility excellent or superb.	Extensive sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility - though more hazy afternoon.
How Cold? (at 750m)	8 or 9C	9C
Freezing Level	Above the summits. Possible slight ground frost some inland valleys at dawn.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 13 September, 2019**

High pressure will develop, initially over southern Britain from this weekend, bringing extensive fine weather with light winds. Sunshine will become extensive. These conditions may well persist most or perhaps all of next week. However, this weekend, Scotland (particularly the W & NW Highlands) will still be windy with rain and low cloud as a front moves slowly southward.
