


Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales, including highest point in Preseli Hills.



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General Summary for Friday, 13 September, 2019



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 September, 2019

After a chilly dawn, a fine day will follow for most areas with fairly extensive sunshine; but often through high level cloud. However, blustery and chilly westerly winds will give cloudier conditions across central and northern Scotland with drizzly rain affecting the west and more widely the northwest Highlands.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Chilly dawn, then fine with extensive sun and light winds.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 13 September, 2019

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly or variable, 5-10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain
Cloud on the hills?	Not expected
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sun. Visibility excellent or superb.
How Cold? (at 750m)	8 or 9C
Freezing Level	Above the summits. Possible slight ground frost some inland valleys at dawn.

Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Saturday 14 September	Sunday 15 September
How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 10mph to perhaps later 15mph.	Westerly in the range 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain	Largely dry. Very likely most of the day dry. However, risk later in the day of a few patches of rain edging in from the northwest.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little if any	Likely becoming fairly extensive Low confidence: Hills perhaps clear at first, but increasing risk through the day of cloud lowering on to higher slopes and becoming fairly extensive in the west.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility - though more hazy afternoon.	Weak sunshine through high level cloud for a few hours in morning, generally becoming overcast. Visibility good or very good, but perhaps deteriorating later.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9C	13C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 14 September, 2019**

This weekend, Scotland will be windy with upland gales, rain and low cloud as a front moves southward. This front will bring cloudier conditions with patches of rain across England and Wales on Sunday after a fine and warm day here on Saturday. High pressure will develop early next week and become centred close to or over the country, bringing increasingly extensive fine weather with light winds. Sunshine will become extensive. These conditions may well persist most or perhaps all of next week.
