


# Lake District

The entire Lake District National Park, taking in all major summits, including Scafell, Helvellyn, Skiddaw, the Langdales and Old Man of Coniston. Also includes the Howgill Fells east of Kendal (the NW extension of Yorks Dales).



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## General Summary for Thursday, 13 June, 2019



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 13 June, 2019

Low pressure will bring a cold and wet day to most areas with gusty northerly winds and extensive low cloud across many hills. The rain will be focused on E Scotland and NE England. Elsewhere, morning rain breaking into scattered heavy, locally thundery, showers. Far west of Scotland drier with some cloud breaks.

### Headline for Lake District

Extensive hill fog and persistent, at times heavy, rain; risk thunder.

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 13 June, 2019

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northerly, into the afternoon becoming westerly, in the range 15 to 30mph, strongest in the morning.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Expect buffeting and wind chill across the hills throughout the day; may become small for periods.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain, at times heavy, much of the day.</b> Persistent and at time heavy rain for much of the day, risk thunder. Later in the afternoon, rain will tend to ease and leave a legacy of drizzly outbreaks.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive</b> Cloud will shroud the hills extensively through much of the day, often patches forming from lower slopes up. However, there may be local breaks between cloud layers. As rain breaks up later in the day, cloud may lift in places.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Rare if any glimpses of sun. Visibility often poor due to rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	5 to 7C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Lake District - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Confidence of detail low: South to southwesterly, 20-30mph.  <b>Blustery conditions on the fells much of day.</b>	South to southeast, later in the day southwesterly 15-25mph; risk 30mph in west later.  <b>Mostly small, but may impede walking higher tops in west later in the day.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Threat thundery downpours</b> Detail very uncertain, but strong likelihood of clusters of showers, in places some torrential downpours forming (mainly PM) with risk of hail, thunder and lightning.	<b>Showers arriving from the west.</b> A largely dry start, but increasing risk showers developing through the day; these becoming frequent for a time in the afternoon as a front edges in from the west, some heavy bursts risk local thunder.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Often covering tops</b>  Varied, often capping higher tops, but ragged banks of cloud lowering suddenly during and after rain to form on lower slopes.  <b>40%</b>	<b>Mostly little at first, lowering in rain later.</b>  Hills likely mostly clear for many hours. However, as showers develop, patches of cloud will likely lower onto higher slopes and should rain become persistent, hill fog will become fairly extensive.  <b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Brief glimpses of sun, mostly cloudy.  Visibility good away from rain, but some areas often poor.	Occasional sunshine, mainly morning.  Visibility very good or excellent, but lowering in rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	5 to 7C.  Above the summits.	7 lifting to 9 or 10C.  Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 14 June, 2019**

Low pressure will dominate into the weekend, maintaining unsettled conditions across the British Isles. Periods of rain and some heavy downpours with possible thunder and lightning. Temperatures generally cool, and winds often brisk across the hills. Day-to-day forecast detail will stay very uncertain, with occasional windows of drier weather possible locally. Into next week, generally warmer with winds from the south/southwest. Conditions remaining rather cyclonic into next week with further areas of rain or showers, but some hints of pressure building for a time later in the week to give drier weather.
