


Peak District

The southernmost Pennines, covering the entire Peak District National Park, also extending north to hills accessed from Hebden Bridge, and including the hills immediately north of Manchester.



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General Summary for Sunday, 21 April, 2019



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 21 April, 2019

Another warm day with strong sunshine for England & Wales. Dry for much of Scotland too. Toward the W/NW Highlands, a front grazing the coast brings some low cloud, and occasional bursts of rain. Strongest winds also NW Scotland, up to gale force locally.

Headline for Peak District

Warm, strong sunshine. Breeze fairly light.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 21 April, 2019

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly, 10-15mph or at times less in morning. Tending to increase a little, nearer 20mph by late afternoon or evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills generally clear Isolated patches of low cloud on some slopes, or areas of valley mist at dawn, but these all breaking up by mid morning. Then widely clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon almost certain.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely sunny. Visibility generally good or very good; slight haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	12 to 14C
And in the valleys	4 to 6C at dawn, rising to 19 to 22C in the afternoon.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Monday 22 April	Tuesday 23 April
How windy? (On the summits)	South to southeasterly 20-25mph.	Easterly 20 to 25mph, perhaps locally 30-35mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, but fairly gusty at times with local buffeting.	Blustery across the hills, in places gusty to some lower slopes.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Very little Isolated pockets of low cloud some eastern slopes around dawn. Otherwise, hills clear.	Little if any Any fragments around some slopes will soon clear in the morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Greater than 90%	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine. A general haze.	Sunshine generally extensive, sometimes obscured by high level cloud. Distant visibility reduced by haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	12 to 14C.	9 to 12C.
And in the valleys	Starting close to 5C some valleys, but rising quickly, to max 19 to 21C, highest in west.	Rising from 6 to 9C at dawn, to 19 to 22C by early afternoon, warmest toward Manchester.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 22 April, 2019**

Warm southeasterly winds to begin the week, with most places staying dry early in the week; blustery in places, locally E-SE'ly gales, with strong gusts to some lower slopes. By Wednesday and Thursday, as low pressure encroaches in from the west, there is an increasing risk of heavy, thundery bursts of rain breaking out, these initially focused on England & Wales, then likely advancing north into Scotland. Cooler and mixed into next weekend, with some rain or showers. Indications toward the very end of April suggest a chillier northerly flow may well develop.
