


# Peak District

The southernmost Pennines, covering the entire Peak District National Park, also extending north to hills accessed from Hebden Bridge, and including the hills immediately north of Manchester.



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## General Summary for Thursday, 13 June, 2019



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 13 June, 2019

Low pressure will bring a cold and wet day to most areas with gusty northerly winds and extensive low cloud across many hills. The rain will be focused on E Scotland and NE England. Elsewhere, morning rain breaking into scattered heavy, locally thundery, showers. Far west of Scotland drier with some cloud breaks.

### Headline for Peak District

Extensive low cloud tops. Rain breaking up to showers, risk thunder.

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 13 June, 2019

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Direction variable from dawn, but becoming westerly afternoon, 15 to 25mph, local lulls.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small, but marked chill in exposure to the wind.
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain then showers, risk thunder PM.</b> Areas of rain through the morning will break down into scattered showers. Risk of slow-moving torrential downpours forming into the afternoon with thunder and lightning.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive on tops</b> Often covering higher terrain through the day, brief breaks to 600m, but ragged patches suddenly dropping to lower slopes during and after rain.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Rare if any glimpses of sun. Visibility often poor due to rain.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	7 to 9C.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Up to 16C away from rain, but often nearer 10 to 12C.

## Peak District - Looking Ahead

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Confidence of detail low: South to southwesterly, 15-25mph.	South to southeast, later in the day southwesterly 15-20mph; risk 25mph later.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small, but may impede walking on tops much of day.</b>	<b>Fairly small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Threat thundery downpours</b> Detail very uncertain, but strong likelihood of clusters of showers, in places some torrential downpours forming (mainly PM) with risk of hail, thunder and lightning.	<b>Showers arriving from the west.</b> A largely dry start, but increasing risk showers developing through the day; these becoming frequent for a time in the afternoon as a front edges in from the west, some heavy bursts risk local thunder.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Mostly around rain</b> Varied, breaks at times to highest summits, but ragged banks of cloud lowering suddenly during and after rain to form on lower slopes.	<b>Very little, lowering onto tops in rain later.</b> Hills likely widely clear for many hours. However, as showers develop, patches of cloud will likely lower onto higher tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>60%</b>	<b>80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Brief glimpses of sun, mostly cloudy. Visibility good away from rain, but some areas often poor.	Occasional sunshine, mainly morning. Visibility very good or excellent, but lowering in rain.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	7 to 10C.	8 to 10C.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	15 to 18C, warmest eastern valleys.	Lifting to highs of 16 or 17C.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 14 June, 2019**

Low pressure will dominate into the weekend, maintaining unsettled conditions across the British Isles. Periods of rain and some heavy downpours with possible thunder and lightning. Temperatures generally cool, and winds often brisk across the hills. Day-to-day forecast detail will stay very uncertain, with occasional windows of drier weather possible locally. Into next week, generally warmer with winds from the south/southwest. Conditions remaining rather cyclonic into next week with further areas of rain or showers, but some hints of pressure building for a time later in the week to give drier weather.
