



General Summary for Thursday, 12 September, 2019



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 September, 2019

Strong winds, rain and copious low cloud will accompany a wave on a front that will run northeast across Britain. Northern Scotland will be north of this - although still blustery with showers.

Headline for Snowdonia National Park

Upland wind near gale; rain and low cloud.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 12 September, 2019

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly, soon in the range 35 to 45mph, perhaps temporarily 50mph Snowdon range. Will begin to ease late afternoon onwards.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking soon arduous, perhaps difficult Snowdon range, where exposed on higher areas, and sudden gusts reaching some lower slopes and valleys northeast of higher tops and ridges.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain or drizzle; some heavy bursts Rain and drizzle mainly western mountains morning. The rain then more widespread for a few hours, again most persistent west Wales. Total rainfall small easternmost summits. Will mostly or all clear toward evening.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills foggy all day Fog persistent, widely from lower slopes up, particularly western mountains.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost nil
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine rarely valleys east Wales. Visibility very poor most or all day, particularly western hills.
How Cold? (at 900m)	12C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Northwesterly or variable, 5-10mph or less. Negligible.	Southerly progressively strengthening during day from around 10mph to 20, or perhaps 25mph Snowdon range. Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain	No rain
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Not expected Above 90%	Very little if any 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sun, but sometimes weak through high cloud. Visibility excellent or superb.	Extensive sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility - though more hazy afternoon.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	7 or 8C Above the summits. Possible slight ground frost some inland valleys at dawn.	8C Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 13 September, 2019**

High pressure will develop, initially over southern Britain from this weekend, bringing extensive fine weather with light winds. Sunshine will become extensive. These conditions may well persist most or perhaps all of next week. However, this weekend, Scotland (particularly the W & NW Highlands) will still be windy with rain and low cloud as a front moves slowly southward.
