
Also includes all higher summits in southern half of Wales.



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General Summary for Sunday, 13 August, 2017



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 August, 2017

A transient ridge of high pressure will cross the UK during the day. There will be a few showers over western hills during the morning moving inland by afternoon. Many hills will be cloud free after any early morning low cloud disperses. Fairly light winds across all areas, but with a freshening southerly breeze by evening across western Scotland.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Largely dry and cloud free

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 13 August, 2017

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable in direction, 10mph or less. Becoming southerly 15mph during evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible until evening
How wet?	Rain not expected Dry most of the day. Small risk of a little rain from dusk.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little until late in the day Any early low cloud or valley fog will soon lift and disperse to leave all hills clear of cloud by late morning. However, from late afternoon, and more especially into the evening, cloud will gradually lower onto the hills to the south of Brecon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%
Sunshine and air clarity?	Occasional sunshine and very good visibilities.
How Cold? (at 750m)	10C
Freezing Level	Above the summits

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 15-20mph, locally 25mph higher peaks.	Southwest veering westerly: 15-25mph
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small	Mainly small
How wet?	Often dry, but risk of rain for a few hours Risk of a few hours of patchy rain during the morning, mainly across western hills. However, this will likely clear for the afternoon, before returning again evening.	Showers, perhaps longer spells of rain Showery rain on and off for much of the day, heaviest and most persistent Brecon Beacons. Perhaps becoming drier towards evening from the west.
Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive Tops mainly shrouded in cloud in rain, although may clear intermittently during the afternoon.	Extensive morning tending to break later Most if not all hill shrouded in cloud in the morning. Bases tending to lift and break from the west afternoon outside showers/rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%	40%
Sunshine and air clarity?	Glimpses of hazy sun possible during afternoon, otherwise little if any sunshine. Visibility intermittently good away from rain and hill fog, but noticeable slight haze.	Fairly extensive poor visibility in hill fog morning. Glimpses of sunshine by afternoon with very good visibility developing.
How Cold? (at 750m)	11-12C	10 to 12C
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 14 August, 2017**

A continuation of the current unsettled weather pattern through next week with southwesterly winds bringing bands of low cloud and rain countrywide, although a transient ridge of high pressure will result in an improvement in conditions on Tuesday. From midweek onwards, increasing threat of upland gales and on western mountains heavy rain with areas of low pressure passing close by the UK.
