

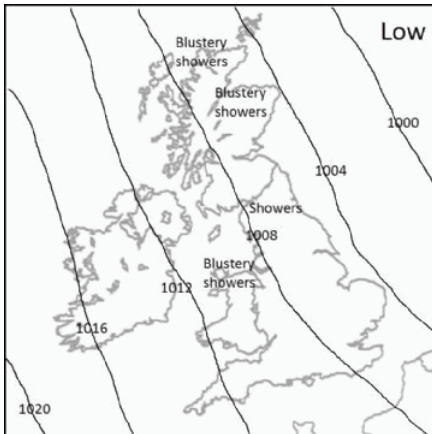
# Brecon Beacons

Also includes all higher summits in southern half of Wales.



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## General Summary for Thursday, 14 September, 2017



**British Mountain Summary:**  
**Based on forecast chart for noon 14 September, 2017**

A cold north-northwesterly flow will cover the UK during the day. Cairngorms, NW Highlands and Snowdonia will remain mainly cloudy with the showers most frequent here. Further south and east hills often clear and dry, with some excellent visibility and just the risk a few showers by afternoon. Significant windchill all areas.

**Headline for Brecon Beacons**

A few showers, but many hills clear of cloud.

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 14 September, 2017

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northwesterly; 20 to 30mph
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Walking often arduous on higher areas. Significant windchill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b>	<b>Showers</b> Brief showers mainly areas west of Brecon. A few brief showers elsewhere in afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Mostly clearing</b> Cloud often shrouding higher slopes after dawn will tend to lift and break above tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine and air clarity?</b>	Sunshine, mainly morning. Cloud may then fill in. Excellent visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	7C but feeling like zero in the wind
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

	<b>Friday 15 September</b>	<b>Saturday 16 September</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	North to northwesterly 20-30mph, perhaps 40mph around dawn.	North to northwesterly 15-25mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Will impede walking across higher areas in the morning.</b>	<b>May impede walking at times across higher areas.</b>
<b>How wet?</b>	<b>Showers developing</b> Showers will be fairly widespread, especially in the morning and heavy at times. Perhaps some drier spells developing during the afternoon.	<b>Showers developing</b> Mostly dry in the morning, but showers will develop fairly widely, with some heavy perhaps with a risk of thunder and hail.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Early low cloud soon lifting.</b>  Early low cloud, mainly hills near and west of Brecon, will lift and break up by late morning. Then hills mainly clear, but intermittently lowering on to tops in showers.	<b>Early low cloud soon lifting.</b>  Early low cloud, mainly hills near and west of Brecon, will lift and break up by late morning. Then hills mainly free of cloud, but intermittently lowering on to tops above 500m in showers.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>70%</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine and air clarity?</b>	Periods of sunshine.  Visibility excellent but intermittently poor in showers.	Periods of sunshine outside showers.  Visibility excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	6C	6C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above summits	Above summits

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 15 September, 2017**

Cold and showery across all mountain areas through the remainder of this week. On highest Scottish summits showers will fall as sleet and wet snow. By Sunday and through the early days of next week, as pressure builds from the south, winds will back more westerly. It will become warmer with drier conditions than of late, but with spells of patchy rain mainly over western half of the Highlands.
