


# Lake District

Includes the whole of Cumbria, and also the western Pennines North from Ingleborough.



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## General Summary for Monday, 17 July, 2017



**British Mountain Summary:  
Based on forecast chart for noon 17 July, 2017**

High pressure builds across the British Isles. A brisk westerly wind will ease slowly and become confined to the far north of Scotland. Drizzly showers and low cloud for the W & NW Highlands, otherwise dry with plenty of sunshine and any low cloud breaking up.

**Headline for Lake District**

Wind becoming light. Dry, most tops clear or clearing.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 17 July, 2017

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly, 15-20, locally 25mph morning, strongest post-dawn. Northwesternly or variable 10-15mph or less afternoon.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small</b>
<b>How wet?</b>	<b>Rain not expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Mostly all clearing</b> Patches of cloud some higher slopes and corries western fells in the morning, but breaking above most or all tops by afternoon.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>60% early morning; 90% afternoon.</b>
<b>Sunshine and air clarity?</b>	Sunshine becoming increasingly extensive, but hazy at times. Visibility generally very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	8 rising to 12C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above summits

## Lake District - Looking Ahead

	<b>Tuesday 18 July</b>	<b>Wednesday 19 July</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	East to southeasterly, 10-15mph increasing to 25 later 30mph.  <b>Mainly small, but may result in local buffeting late in day.</b>	Low confidence of detail in this forecast: East veering southerly, 30 to 45mph, may ease through day.  <b>Walking may be widely arduous with considerable buffeting where exposed, perhaps easing.</b>
<b>How wet?</b>	<b>Rain not expected</b>	<b>Risk of thunderstorms</b>  Detail very uncertain: Pulses of heavy rain and possible thunderstorms spreading from the south, may give local torrential falls.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Largely cloud free</b>  <b>95%</b>	<b>Extensive around rain</b>  Shrouding the hills most or all day, from forest canopies up during and following rain. At times breaks may form to higher tops.  <b>40%</b>
<b>Sunshine and air clarity?</b>	Excellent visibility and long spells of sunshine, but becoming hazy later in the day.	Any sunshine generally hazy. Visibility reduced around rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	12 to 14C  Above summits	13 to 16C; humid.  Above summits

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 18 July, 2017**

High pressure retreats away eastwards allowing pressure to fall into midweek. A brief surge of warm and humid air will push north across Britain by Wednesday, and there will be areas of rain and thunderstorms - precise detail remains uncertain. Later in the week, and most likely into the weekend, expect a changeable mix of sunshine and heavy showers, or some longer periods of rain as low pressure resides across the country. Blustery winds at times, and feeling cool.
