


# Peak District and Yorkshire Dales

The Peak district and Yorkshire Dales National Parks and the area immediately between them.



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## General Summary for Monday, 17 July, 2017



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 17 July, 2017

High pressure builds across the British Isles. A brisk westerly wind will ease slowly and become confined to the far north of Scotland. Drizzly showers and low cloud for the W & NW Highlands, otherwise dry with plenty of sunshine and any low cloud breaking up.

### Headline for Peak District and Yorkshire Dales

Wind becoming light. Dry, patches of low cloud clearing.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 17 July, 2017

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly, 15-20mph early morning, strongest Yorks Dales. Easing to 10mph or at times less into afternoon. Direction later variable.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Soon small
<b>How wet?</b>	Rain not expected
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>All clearing</b> Patches of cloud confined to higher tops in western Yorks Dales in morning, but soon all breaking up.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>70% morning west; becoming almost certain.</b>
<b>Sunshine and air clarity?</b>	Sunshine throughout the day, but may be weak through high cloud at first in south. Visibility excellent.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	10 rising to 15C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Below 10C some valleys at dawn. Max 21 to 23C by afternoon; warmest eastern dales.

## Peak District and Yorkshire Dales - Looking Ahead

	<b>Tuesday 18 July</b>	<b>Wednesday 19 July</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southeast later easterly, 15-25mph, locally 30mph later.	Low confidence of detail in this forecast: East veering southerly, 25 to 40mph, may ease through day.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small, but may result in local buffeting later in day.</b>	<b>Walking may be widely arduous with considerable buffeting where exposed, perhaps easing.</b>
<b>How wet?</b>	<b>Rain not expected</b>	<b>Risk of thunderstorms</b> Detail very uncertain: Pulses of heavy rain and possible thunderstorms, may give local torrential falls. Tending to clear northwards, but scattered downpours may follow.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Largely cloud free</b>	<b>Extensive around rain</b> Shrouding the hills most or all day, from forest canopies up during and following rain. At times breaks may form to higher tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>95%</b>	<b>50%</b>
<b>Sunshine and air clarity?</b>	Excellent visibility and long spells of sunshine, but becoming hazy later in the day.	Any sunshine generally hazy. Visibility reduced around rain.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	13 to 16C	14 to 18C; humid.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	21 to 24C; warmest western valleys and Peak District.	A muggy 19 to 23C, perhaps up to 25C away from rain.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 18 July, 2017**

High pressure retreats away eastwards allowing pressure to fall into midweek. A brief surge of warm and humid air will push north across Britain by Wednesday, and there will be areas of rain and thunderstorms - precise detail remains uncertain. Later in the week, and most likely into the weekend, expect a changeable mix of sunshine and heavy showers, or some longer periods of rain as low pressure resides across the country. Blustery winds at times, and feeling cool.
