

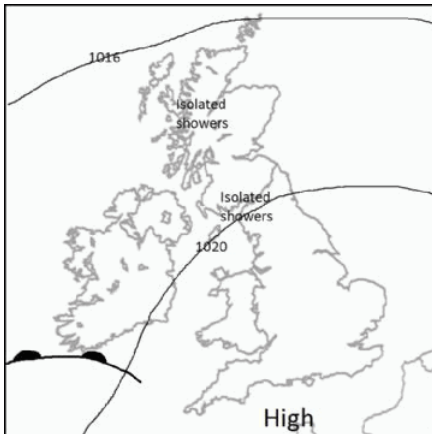

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General Summary for Sunday, 13 August, 2017



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 13 August, 2017

A transient ridge of high pressure will cross the UK during the day. There will be a few showers over Scottish highlands and here cloud will persist on higher western summits. Elsewhere, hills largely cloud free, patches of sun and light and.

Headline for Peak District and Yorkshire Dales

Largely dry and cloud free

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 13 August, 2017

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly 10-15mph at first, soon becoming variable less than 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Soon becoming negligible
How wet?	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Very little Any early low cloud or valley fog will soon lift and disperse to leave all hills clear of cloud by late morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%
Sunshine and air clarity?	Periods of sunshine with excellent visibilities.
Temperature (at 600m)	11-13C
And in the valleys	Into the valleys: 17-21C, warmest Peak District

Peak District and Yorkshire Dales - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 15-20mph, locally 25mph higher peaks.	Southwest veering westerly: 15-25mph, but occasionally 30mph morning Pennines
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small	Mainly small
How wet?	Often dry, but risk of rain for a few hours Risk of a few hours of patchy rain during the morning across the Pennines and Y.Dales. Otherwise, often dry through the day, but a few showers may develop later in the afternoon.	Rain on and off Showery rain on and off for much of the day, heaviest and most persistent over the Pennines and western Moors. Perhaps becoming drier towards evening from the west.
Cloud on the hills?	Often clear Hills will be largely free of hill fog for much of the day. However, a few patches may shroud higher areas of the Pennines morning.	Extensive morning tending to break later Most if not all hill shrouded in cloud in the morning. Bases tending to lift and break from the west afternoon/evening outside showers/rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	60%
Sunshine and air clarity?	Glimpses of hazy sunshine. Visibility generally good away from rain and hill fog, but noticeable slight haze.	Fairly extensive poor visibility in hill fog morning, especially Pennines. Glimpses of sunshine by afternoon with very good visibility developing.
Temperature (at 600m)	12-14C	11 to 13C
And in the valleys	In the valleys: 18-21C, warmest Peak District	In the valleys: 16-20C, highest Eastern Dales

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 14 August, 2017**

A continuation of the current unsettled weather pattern through next week with southwesterly winds bringing bands of low cloud and rain countrywide, although a transient ridge of high pressure will result in an improvement in conditions on Tuesday. From midweek onwards, increasing threat of upland gales and on western mountains heavy rain with areas of low pressure passing close by the UK.
