


Peak District and Yorkshire Dales

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General Summary for Thursday, 12 July, 2018



**British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 12 July, 2018**

A weak front will bring largely cloudy and damp conditions across the Scottish Highlands with cloud shrouding the hills much of the day; but tending to lift to higher slopes with local showers breaking out. Elsewhere, early patches of mist and low cloud will lift and clear, but scattered showers will develop.

Headline for Peak District and Yorkshire Dales

Patchy mist and low cloud clearing. Scattered showers developing.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 12 July, 2018

How windy? (On the summits)	Direction variable, mostly easterly, 5 to 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Scattered showers Many places substantially dry, but isolated patches of rain or drizzle locally in the morning. However, scattered showers will develop into the afternoon. However, some areas will miss these and stay dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Becoming very little Patches of low cloud, or mist in some valleys from dawn. Cloud likely all lifting above the hills through the morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and variable cloud, may fill in at times. Visibility typically good; slight haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	13 to 16C
And in the valleys	Reaching 22 to 25C, locally a degree or so warmer in Peak District.

Peak District and Yorkshire Dales - Looking Ahead

	Friday 13 July	Saturday 14 July
How windy? (On the summits)	Direction variable, little wind much of day. Locally gusty around showers.	Westerly around 10mph, later 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk a thunderstorm A few drizzly outbreaks or even a local burst of rain possible from early morning, but many places often dry. Increasing threat of local heavy showers or thunderstorms afternoon/evening.	Isolated, if any, showers Very likely dry all day. However, risk of isolated showers developing into the afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Breaks to high tops Banks of cloud at various levels from lower slopes up post-dawn. Most cloud lifting above 700m by afternoon or perhaps sooner.	Very little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sunshine breaking through. Visibility typically very good; locally murky early in day.	Periods of sunshine. Visibility generally very good.
Temperature (at 600m)	14 to 17C, quite humid.	16C
And in the valleys	Max 22 to 26C, warmest Peak District.	22-24C

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 13 July, 2018**

Pressure stays fairly high on Friday, but some instability in the atmosphere will trigger a few showers over the hills - local thunderstorms possible. Areas of low cloud, but also breaks to many higher summits. Winds generally very light. By the weekend, weak fronts to edge east across Scotland bringing a little drizzly rain and low cloud; mainly across western hills. It will remain largely dry across England and Wales. A fairly slack pressure pattern is likely into next week, and with a warm and quite humid airmass in place, showers will develop; these perhaps more widespread later in the week.
