



General Summary for Friday, 13 July, 2018



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 13 July, 2018

A fairly humid day with little wind. Isolated patches of rain or drizzle in the morning will develop into scattered showers by afternoon. These will be heaviest from southern Scotland southwards with some isolated thunderstorms. Areas of low cloud in the morning will lift to higher tops into the afternoon. Best conditions in the northwest Highlands.

Headline for Peak District and Yorkshire Dales

Fairly humid, little wind. Cloud lifting to high tops. Showers developing.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 13 July, 2018

How windy? (On the summits)	Direction variable, little wind much of day. Locally gusty around showers.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk of a thunderstorm A few drizzly outbreaks or even a local burst of rain possible from early morning, but many places often dry. Increasing threat of local heavy showers or thunderstorms afternoon/evening.
Cloud on the hills?	Breaks to high tops Banks of cloud at various levels from lower slopes up post-dawn. Most cloud lifting above 700m by afternoon or perhaps sooner. However, isolated patches will reform to lower slopes in rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sunshine breaking through. Visibility typically very good; locally murky early in day.
Temperature (at 600m)	14 to 17C, quite humid.
And in the valleys	Max 21 to 25C, warmest Peak District.

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly around 10mph, later 15mph.	Southwest around 10mph, but 15mph at times across the western dales.
Effect of wind on you?	Small	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Isolated, if any, showers Very likely dry all day. However, risk of isolated showers developing into the afternoon.	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Very little if any	Early mist/low cloud clearing. Patches of low cloud or mist around dawn, mainly in the west, will lift and clear by midday.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine. Visibility generally very good.	Occasional sunshine breaking through. Visibility generally very good.
Temperature (at 600m)	16C	16 to 18C
And in the valleys	22-24C	23 to 26C

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 14 July, 2018**

Over the weekend, weak fronts to edge east across Scotland bringing a little drizzly rain and low cloud; mainly across western hills. It will remain largely dry and warm across England and Wales with occasional sunshine. A fairly slack pressure pattern into the start of next week, and with a warm and quite humid airmass in place, showers will develop; these locally thundery, and perhaps more widespread later in the week. Areas of low cloud will shroud the hills at times.
