



General Summary for Monday, 17 July, 2017



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 17 July, 2017

High pressure builds across the British Isles. A brisk westerly wind will ease slowly and become confined to the far north of Scotland. Drizzly showers and low cloud for the W & NW Highlands, otherwise dry with plenty of sunshine and any low cloud breaking up.

Headline for Snowdonia National Park

Light winds. Dry, any low cloud breaking up.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 17 July, 2017

How windy? (On the summits)	North to northwesterly, or variable, later easterly; 10-15mph or often less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet?	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	All clearing Higher areas may hold fragments of cloud for a time in the morning, but all breaking up.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80% early morning; becoming almost certain.
Sunshine and air clarity?	Sunshine throughout the day, but may be weak through high cloud at first. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8 rising to 11C
Freezing Level	Above summits

Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 18 July	Wednesday 19 July
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	East to southeasterly, 15-25mph locally 30mph especially later. Fairly small, but may result in local buffeting.	Low confidence of detail in this forecast: Southeast veering southwesterly, 25 up to 40mph, may ease through day. Walking may be arduous with considerable buffeting at times where exposed, perhaps easing.
How wet?	Dry until night Toward or most likely after dark, risk of thundery rain spreading from the south.	Risk of thunderstorms Detail very uncertain: Pulses of heavy rain and possible thunderstorms, may give local torrential falls. Tending to clear northwards, but scattered downpours may follow.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Largely cloud free 90%	Extensive around rain Shrouding the hills most or all day, from forest canopies up during and following rain. At times breaks may form to higher tops. 40%
Sunshine and air clarity?	Excellent visibility and long spells of sunshine, but becoming hazy later in the day.	Any sunshine generally hazy. Visibility reduced around rain.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	11 to 13C Above summits	12 to 15C; humid. Above summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 18 July, 2017**

High pressure retreats away eastwards allowing pressure to fall into midweek. A brief surge of warm and humid air will push north across Britain by Wednesday, and there will be areas of rain and thunderstorms - precise detail remains uncertain. Later in the week, and most likely into the weekend, expect a changeable mix of sunshine and heavy showers, or some longer periods of rain as low pressure resides across the country. Blustery winds at times, and feeling cool.
