



## General Summary for Wednesday, 13 June, 2018



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 13 June, 2018**

Fronts moving in from the west will push rain into W & NW Scotland, becoming persistent and heavy later. SE Scotland, plus England & Wales will stay substantially dry until sunset. Southwesterly winds will strengthen, reaching gale force later, then severe upland gales overnight.

### Headline for Snowdonia National Park

Dry most of day. Rain and upland gales by dusk.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 13 June, 2018

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly, strengthening through day: 10-15mph at first, 20-25mph by midday, then 30-35mph by mid-afternoon onward, nearer 45mph toward dusk, and 50-60mph overnight.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Will impede walking across higher areas by late afternoon with considerable buffeting over the hills by evening, particularly Snowdon range.</b>
<b>How wet?</b>	<b>Dry until late; rain into the night, heaviest west</b> Dry most or all day. Rain arriving from the west toward sunset, then setting in overnight; heaviest Snowdon range, patchier elsewhere.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Generally very little</b> Ribbons of cloud at varying heights from dawn; but these will lift and clear by mid to late morning. Then hills likely clear for much of the day; although cloud will lower onto the higher slopes during the evening.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine and air clarity?</b>	Occasional sunshine will tend to give way through the afternoon as high cloud arrives from west. Visibility generally very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	10C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 14 June	Friday 15 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Southwesterly 45 to 60mph early morning, veering westerly, dropping slowly to 25-35mph afternoon, later 20mph. <b>Expect buffeting across the hills for many hours. Walking difficult at first on higher areas with significant wind chill.</b>	Southwest backing southerly later, around 20mph, but may strengthen to 25-30mph by dusk. <b>Fairly small most of the day.</b>
<b>How wet?</b>	<b>Rain clearing, drizzly showers</b> Overnight rain should move through, but showers coming in from the west may be frequent over a few hours, although becoming drizzly, and tending to fade.	<b>Largely dry</b> Most or all day dry. Small chance an isolated passing shower inland by afternoon. Risk of rain developing from the west into the night.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive, base lifting</b> Widely shrouding the hills at first, patches to low levels. Cloud base tending to lift through the day, with breaks forming to 600-800m, or higher east Wales.	<b>Breaks to most tops</b> Most cloud confined above 700m by mid-morning, and clearing most higher summits by afternoon, or perhaps sooner east Wales.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40%</b>	<b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine and air clarity?</b>	Glimpses of sun, mostly east. Visibility very good at times, but reduced significantly by rain.	Patchwork of sun, although cloud tending to fill in. Visibility mostly very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b> <b>Freezing Level</b>	7 to 9C. Above the summits.	7 to 9C. Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 14 June, 2018**

Changeable conditions over the next week or so as frontal systems come in from the Atlantic. Spells of rain, most persistent on western mountains, accompanied by low cloud. Rain tending to focus on western Scotland next week, whilst England, Wales and the eastern Highlands should see just small amounts. Winds varied, but at times blustery, some days up to gale force on the mountains. Temperatures close to average, but cooler than recent times for many, particularly western Scotland.
