



General Summary for Friday, 10 August, 2018



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 August, 2018

Widespread showers - generally transferring from western mountains to areas well inland where in afternoon there will be thunderstorms and in places the rain, often heavy becoming constant for an hour or two. Fairly light wind - though temporarily gusty near rain.

Headline for Snowdonia National Park

Cold; heavy showers. Risk hail and thunder. Fairly light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 10 August, 2018

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 15 to occasionally 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Heavy showers; risk thunder, mainly well inland. Showers morning, mainly west Wales. The rain transferring eastwards, showers becoming heavy by midday over east Wales. In afternoon the rain may not stop locally for an hour or so; risk hail & thunder. However, initially near the coast, showers will become infrequent west Wales.
Cloud on the hills?	Often above the summits. Nevertheless, quickly forming near rain. Cloud base will vary. Generally, the cloud above the summits by mid-morning. However, near rain, cloud will form quickly, in places from lower slopes up.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bursts of sunshine between showers; most extensive west Wales afternoon. Visibility excellent but deteriorating quickly in heavy rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C, rising to 9C east Wales
Freezing Level	Above the summits

	Saturday 11 August	Sunday 12 August
How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 15mph; increasing to 30 to 35mph from middle of day or afternoon.	Low confidence in this forecast. Southerly; 20 to 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking will become increasingly arduous on the hills; local sudden buffeting on lower slopes.	May impede ease of walking for periods on higher areas.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Increasingly wet Rain setting in. However, timing very uncertain. There may be very little, if any rain at all during morning, before in the afternoon the rain gradually becomes more widespread.	Rain probable Overnight rain will have cleared. However, there is uncertainty as to the existence and track of a following band of heavy, perhaps thundery rain. This most likely during the morning
Cloud on the hills?	Becoming extensive Low confidence: Hills cloud free, perhaps most of the day in some areas. However, in rain, fog will increasingly shroud the hills.	Likely to form in rain The summits may often free of cloud, particularly well inland, although in rain fog is likely to form on higher areas, or from lower slopes up toward the west coast.
Chance of cloud free summits?	40%	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine will give way, probably during the morning as high level cloud progressively thickens. Visibility excellent, before before widely poor in rain.	Sunshine intermittently. Sometimes excellent visibility, but deteriorating markedly in heavy rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7 rising to 12C	11C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 11 August, 2018**

Colder and wetter countryside over the next week to 10 days. Rain (either as periods of constant rain or just showers) likely at some stage most days, although there will also be dry days. Cloud will often shroud higher tops, particularly western mountains in the mornings.
