



## General Summary for Saturday, 11 August, 2018



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 11 August, 2018**

Fine with little wind almost all day almost all of Scotland under a ridge of high pressure. From the south across Wales and later N England and by dusk S Scotland, windier, increasingly wet and foggy.

### Headline for Snowdonia National Park

Dry; little wind at first. Deteriorating: increasingly windy, wet and foggy.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 11 August, 2018

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southerly 10mph; progressively increasing from late morning to reach 25 to 35mph evening.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Walking will become increasingly arduous on the hills afternoon; local sudden buffeting on lower slopes.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Increasingly wet afternoon; risk lightning</b> Rain starting middle of day, initially mid-Wales. Will become increasingly persistent and heavy thundery bursts likely.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Becoming extensive</b> Low confidence: Hills cloud free, perhaps most of the day in some areas. However, generally from middle of the day will deteriorate as in rain, fog increasingly shrouds the hills. In and after heavy rain, cloud likely on some lower slopes and widely above 550m.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Almost certain morning; dropping to less than 10% through afternoon</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Sunshine will give way, probably during the morning as high level cloud progressively thickens. Visibility excellent, before before widely poor in rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	7 rising to 12C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

## Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	<b>Sunday 12 August</b>	<b>Monday 13 August</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Low confidence in this forecast. Southerly; 20 to 25mph.	West or northwesterly 10mph after dawn. Will tend to increase to 20, perhaps 25mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small.</b>	<b>Fairly small</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Rain probable; risk thunderstorms</b> Scattered heavy showers. Additionally uncertainty as to the track of band of heavy, thundery rain. It may bring almost constant rain for 2 to 4 hours, with east Wales at highest risk.	<b>Showers</b> Occasional showers, will tend to migrate inland after being concentrated on hills in west Wales morning.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Likely to form in rain</b>  The summits may often free of cloud, particularly well inland, although in rain fog is likely to form on higher areas, or from lower slopes up toward the west coast.	<b>Becoming confined to higher tops</b>  Fog will shroud higher areas extensively after dawn; lowest west Wales where extensive above 650m. The base will tend to rise, by afternoon, most cloud above 900 or 1000m.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40%</b>	<b>40%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine intermittently. Sometimes excellent visibility, but deteriorating markedly in heavy rain.	Occasional sunshine. Excellent visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	11C.	10C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 12 August, 2018**

Colder and wetter countrywide over the next week or so. Rain (either as periods of constant rain or just showers) likely at some stage on several days, although some days dry. Cloud will often shroud higher tops, particularly western mountains in the mornings.
