



## General Summary for Friday, 9 November, 2018



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 9 November, 2018**

Windy; widespread upland gales Scottish Highlands. Overall extensive fog higher areas, and patches of rain will drift northwards. Through afternoon Wales, and after dusk elsewhere, deteriorating conditions as storm force winds and heavy rain spread north-eastwards.

### Headline for Snowdonia National Park

Upland wind near gale; occasional rain.

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 9 November, 2018

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South or southeasterly, 35mph. Will strengthen to 65mph from west toward dusk.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Arduous walking where exposed on higher areas.</b> <b>Conditions will quickly become very difficult toward dusk.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Showers. Heavy rain toward dusk.</b> A few bursts of rain now and again morning. Then temporarily dry before rain sets in from west before dusk.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Cloud covering higher tops most of the day.</b> Cloud base will tend to rise through morning. By late morning, patches below 650m east Wales, but most cloud confined above 750 to in west Wales 950m. Marked deterioration as fog forms across the hills in rain late in day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Little or no sun. Very hazy.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	2C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	<b>Saturday 10 November</b>	<b>Sunday 11 November</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly 25mph, but up to 35mph at and just after dawn.	Southerly 20 to 30mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Walking arduous and wind chill significant at dawn, but will become fairly small.</b>	<b>Likely to impede ease of walking on higher areas.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Frequent showers</b> Showers, sometimes frequent with the rain almost constant for a couple of hours, particularly west Wales. Risk of thunder.	<b>Showers</b> Intermittently dry, but showers and perhaps over an couple of hours, almost constant rain. Hail higher slopes; risk thunder.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Fairly extensive higher areas</b>  Cloud often shrouding higher areas above 700m in fog, most extensively across Snowdon Range/Cadair Idris, with shafts to or below 500m in showers. Across east Wales, cloud only rarely capping higher tops.	<b>Extensive on higher slopes</b>  Most higher tops covered in cloud, frequently base 850m, dropping to 500m near showers, and perhaps for several hours westernmost slopes Lleyn peninsula to Snowdon. There may be breaks to higher tops for a couple of hours.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>30%</b>	<b>40%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Bursts of sunshine, particularly across east Wales.  Visibility generally good or in east Wales very good.	Sunshine occasionally. Visibility often excellent, but abruptly poor in rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	3C	4C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Just above highest tops.	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 10 November, 2018**

Winds almost constantly southerly over the next week to ten days will mean only higher summits in Scotland occasionally below freezing point. Rain at some stage most days (although probably drier from mid-week next week). Often windy and fog will frequently shroud the summits - and at times even lower slopes. Generally least rainfall and often little low cloud NW Highlands.
