


Southeastern Highlands

Hills accessed from Callander, Loch Tay and Loch Rannoch areas. Areas east of Loch Ericht, and south of Dalwhinnie, upper Glen Feshie and the River Dee (includes southernmost Cairngorm NP).



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General Summary for Friday, 10 August, 2018



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 August, 2018

Widespread showers - generally transferring from western mountains to areas well inland where in afternoon there will be thunderstorms and in places the rain, often heavy becoming constant for an hour or two. Fairly light wind - though temporarily gusty near rain.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Cold; heavy showers becoming widespread, hail and thunder. Light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 10 August, 2018

How windy? (On the Munros)	Westerly 5 to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Heavy showers and thunderstorms, mainly afternoon. Showers from mid to late morning (isolated earlier in day). In afternoon areas of showers may well merge to give persistent, often heavy rain, and sometimes hail, over a couple of hours and also thunderstorms.
Cloud on the hills?	Often above the summits. Nevertheless, quickly forming near rain. Cloud base will vary. Generally, the cloud above the summits. However, near rain, cloud will form quickly and widely, in places from lower slopes up.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sunshine between showers; most extensive along west coast in afternoon. Visibility generally excellent but deteriorating quickly in heavy rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	5 rising to 9C
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Saturday 11 August	Sunday 12 August
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	West backing south to southeasterly, 10 to 15mph., although may reach 20, or possibly west of A9, 25-30mph by dusk. Small either all day or until evening.	Low confidence in this forecast. Southeast or southerly; 10-20mph. Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little or no rain Risk isolated passing showers morning, and of steadier rain spreading from southwest in evening.	Rain very likely A band of rain likely to clear northwards, perhaps by or soon after dawn. Very wet underfoot Dumfries and Galloway. There is then uncertainty as to the extent of showers, or further persistent, possibly thundery rain, following from south.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills substantially cloud free Many summits free of cloud most or all daylight.	Intermittently clearing Fog, probably very likely widespread after dawn will lift to or above higher tops following clearance of rain. However, the cloud base likely to lower again in further rain.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	80%	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine in and out, although cloud will tend to fill in. Visibility excellent.	Sunshine intermittently. Frequently excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	5 rising to 10C Above the summits	10 to 13C. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 11 August, 2018**

Colder and wetter countrywide over the next week to 10 days. Rain (either as periods of constant rain or just showers) likely at some stage most days, although there will also be dry days. Cloud will often shroud higher tops, particularly western mountains in the mornings.
