The Galloway hills eastward to the Lammermuir hills. The Cheviots (including higher hills within the adjacent Northumberland NP).



General Summary for Friday, 13 July, 2018



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 July, 2018

A fairly humid day with little wind. Isolated patches of rain or drizzle in the morning will develop into scattered showers by afternoon. These will be heaviest from southern Scotland southwards with some isolated thunderstorms. Areas of low cloud in the morning will lift to higher tops into the afternoon. Best conditions in the northwest Highlands.

Headline for Southern Uplands

Fairly humid, little wind. Cloud lifting to high tops. Showers developing.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 13 July, 2018

How windy? (On the summits)	Direction variable, little wind much of day. Locally gusty around showers.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Scattered showers developing A few drizzly outbreaks or even a local burst of rain possible from early morning, but many places often dry. Increasing threat of local heavy showers afternoon/evening.
Cloud on the hills?	Low cloud lifting to high tops Banks of cloud at various levels from lower slopes up post-dawn. Most cloud lifting above 700-800m by afternoon or perhaps sooner, with many hills clearing. However, local pockets of cloud may reform temporarily to lower slopes in showers.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%, but 60% by afternoon
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sunshine breaking through, sunniest near Solway coast in afternoon. Visibility typically very good; locally murky early in day.
How Cold? (at 750m)	12 to 14C, quite humid.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small	Mostly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Dry until evening Dry for much of the day, but increasing threat of patchy rain or drizzle arriving from the west into the evening.	Little, or no, rain Isolated patches of light rain or drizzle across western hills from time to time.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little until late afternoon/evening Hills very likely clear for much of the day. However, from late afternoon, cloud will thicken and lower onto the hills and later become extensive, later to lower slopes in the west.	Low cloud lifting to higher tops in west. Banks of low cloud from dawn, mainly across western hills, will lift and generally clear by midday. However, a few patches may continue to come and go across the highest tops in the west.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sunshine; clouding over from west later in the afternoon. Visibility very good.	Occasional sunshine breaking through, mainly across eastern hills. Visibility generally very good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	13C	14C
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 14 July, 2018**

Over the weekend, weak fronts to edge east across Scotland bringing a little drizzly rain and low cloud; mainly across western hills. It will remain largely dry and warm across England and Wales with occasional sunshine. A fairly slack pressure pattern into the start of next week, and with a warm and quite humid airmass in place, showers will develop; these locally thundery, and perhaps more widespread later in the week. Areas of low cloud will shroud the hills at times.
