

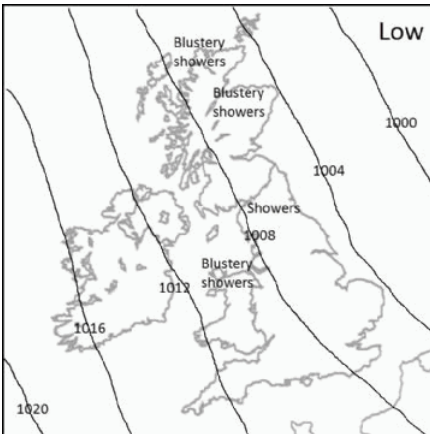
# West Highlands

Western Highlands accessible from, and south of, Glenfinnan (Road to the Isles) and Glen Spean (includes Creag Meagaidh). This area include Ben Nevis and the mountains around Glencoe. In the east, includes Ben Alder south to Loch Lomond and Trossachs NP. Includes Arran and Mull.



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## General Summary for Thursday, 14 September, 2017



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 14 September, 2017**

A cold north-northwesterly flow will cover the UK during the day. Cairngorms, NW Highlands and Snowdonia will remain mainly cloudy with the showers most frequent here. Further south and east hills often clear and dry, with some excellent visibility and just the risk a few showers by afternoon. Significant windchill all areas.

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 14 September, 2017

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	North or northwesterly; 25 to 35mph occasionally 45mph later and along western coastal hills.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Walking often arduous at times difficult on higher areas. Significant windchill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b>	<b>Showers</b> Occasional showers, most likely over western hills in Lochaber, will tend to spread further inland afternoon. However largely dry towards Lomond NP. Snow above 1000m, will lie at times highest tops.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Cloud clearing many tops.</b> Cloud often shrouding higher slopes after dawn, will become confined above most summits by midday, although fragments will form higher areas near showers above 1000m. On Mull, west of Loch Linnhe and near Glen Spean, cloud may well come and go above
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine and air clarity?</b>	Occasional sunshine, mainly morning Loch Lomond NP. Excellent visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	3C but feeling well below zero in the wind
<b>Freezing Level</b>	1300m

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 15 September, 2017**

Cold and showery across all mountain areas through the remainder of this week. On highest Scottish summits showers will fall as sleet and wet snow. By Sunday and through the early days of next week, as pressure builds from the south, winds will back more westerly. It will become warmer with drier conditions than of late, but with spells of patchy rain mainly over western half of the Highlands.
