

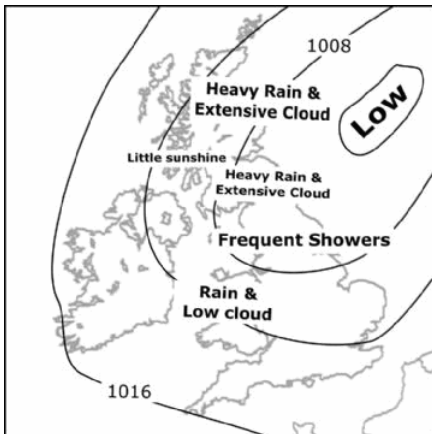
Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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General Summary for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 July, 2024

Rain widely in Highlands, particularly Cairngorms, where risk of local flooding - although very little rain in total near west coast and central belt. Showery bursts of rain southern Scotland southwards, although total rainfall in Wales (specially south and east) will be small. Hardly any sunshine and many higher areas foggy.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Scattered howers, most frequent in the west, gusty winds

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest turning northwesterly, 20 to 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Occasional showers Cambrian range: drizzly showers morning, possibly frequent. Will gradually fizzle out. Elsewhere: Rare brief showers.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly higher western tops Fog across higher areas from dawn, and on western mountains cloud base often below 400m. Will tend to improve, in the afternoon cloud base typically 550m west to 750m east Wales.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun, mainly east Wales. Visibility good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	8 to 10C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable 10-20mph.	Mostly northerly, 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers afternoon possible Mostly dry morning, chance for light showery rain afternoon.	Mostly dry, highest risk rain coast Inland an odd shower possible, but most likely dry. By the coast slightly higher risk of light rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills partly clear Except for some local patches of fog in the morning hills mostly clear toward Brecon Beacons, by Cardigan Bay clouds often shrouding slopes above 500m	Foggy morning, later hills clear In the morning low cloud in the valleys, tops mostly above the clouds. Later cloud lifting and widely breaking.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunny spells in the morning, cloudy afternoon. Very good visibility.	Patchwork of sun and clouds. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9 to 11C	11C
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 11 July, 2024

Cool rest of the week. On Thursday light showers, particularly in northern England, southern Scotland and Wales, Highlands mostly dry. Generally improving toward the weekend, locally showers on Friday, wettest in northern Scotland. Low still circulating east of England may bring wet spells on eastern Highlands and Cheviots on both Friday and during the weekend, but western Highlands, Lake District and Pennines should stay mostly dry and get some sun. Again more widespread rain beginning of next week.
