

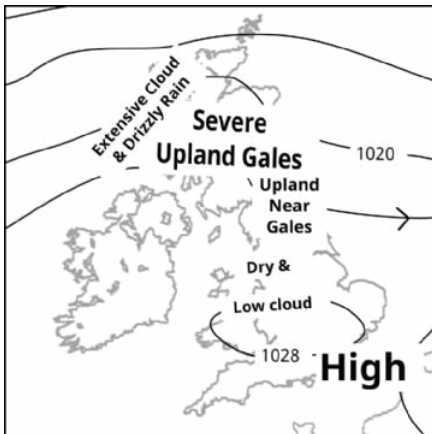
# Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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## General Summary for Thursday, 31 October, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 31 October, 2024**

Widely murky, mostly overcast skies but dry, only in western Scotland drizzle. Mild, but severe wind make it feel cold in Scotland. Marked increase of wind speed with height in the north, severe gales over Scottish mountains. In Wales lot of sunshine above very low clouds.

### Headline for Brecon Beacons

Murky on lower terrain, higher up clear. Dry, warm, calm

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 31 October, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Variable, 15mph or less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Negligible.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Clear except for morning valley fog</b> Frequent morning cloud in the valleys, soon dissipating. Tops likely clear all day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>80%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Overcast and murky most or all day, but above the cloud very sunny. If not in cloud visibility excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	9 to 13C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly or variable, mostly 10 to 15mph or less.	Variable, mostly southerly, 5 to 15mph.

<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Isolated spots of drizzle not fully ruled out, but generally dry.	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Mist in valleys, especially in the morning</b> Low cloud may be fairly widespread in the valleys and on lower hills in the morning, later lifting to higher levels. Above 600-800m frequently clear at start, deteriorating.	High uncertainty, most likely scenario: Low cloud from lower slopes upward, lifting only a little through the day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>60%</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny above the low cloud, but murky in the valleys.  Excellent visibility.	Uncertain, most likely little or no sunshine at all and poor visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	11 to 13C	8 to 10C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 1 November, 2024**

After wet Friday in Scotland, back to high pressure for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion conditions developing mean locally very misty or cloudy, and tops sometimes above cloud. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until mid next week, when a weak front passage will probably deteriorate weather for a day, at least in Scotland. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and warm weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week.
