

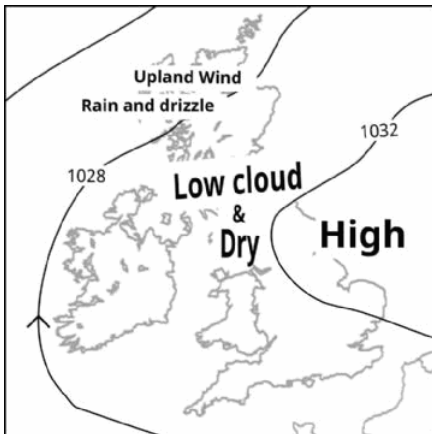
# Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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## General Summary for Saturday, 2 November, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 2 November, 2024

Widely dull and murky, breaks in cloud most likely in eastern Scotland and western Wales. Rain or drizzle in West and Northwest Highlands, elsewhere most likely dry. In northern Scotland windy, elsewhere mostly light winds. Mild.

### Headline for Brecon Beacons

Dry, cloudy, some tops may be above cloud. Mild

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 2 November, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Variable, mostly southeasterly, 10 to 15mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Most likely extensive</b> Low cloud from valley bottom upward in morning, lifting only a little through the day. Some breaks forming in western areas. Highest tops (above 700-800m) have chance to be above the cloud occasionally.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Little or no sunshine at all to east Wales, Western Cambrians may get a few sunny spells. Very good visibility if not in cloud.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	8 to 10C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

	<b>Sunday 3 November</b>	<b>Monday 4 November</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southeasterly, 15-25mph.	Southeasterly, most of the time less than 15mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small.</b>	<b>Small or negligible.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Extensively dry, but chance drizzle here and there.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Varied low cloud banks, clearer west</b>  Low cloud and fog in the valleys, varied from mid-slopes upward, tops clear at times. Some low cloud banks drifting up over hills in southeast, may persist the whole day. Breaks best toward west.	<b>Extensive, but may break up</b>  Confidence low: Cloud probably extensive above 500m from dawn and there may all be ribbons of fog on some lower slopes and in valleys (particularly east Wales). The cloud may partially or completely break up through the day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>50%</b>	<b>50%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Plenty of sunshine and excellent visibility if above the cloud. Hazier or misty lower down in morning, particularly east Wales.	Cloud may well break to give extensive sunshine.  Persistently hazy.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	6 to 9C, lower down much colder.	8C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 3 November, 2024**

High pressure conditions for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion developing means often very misty or cloudy, but tops sometimes above cloud - especially the Munros. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until Tuesday afternoon, when a weak front passage will deteriorate weather for a day along the western coastal mountains especially. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and even warmer weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week. During the weekend, more often wet conditions are likely, but at this stage uncertainty is still fairly high.
