

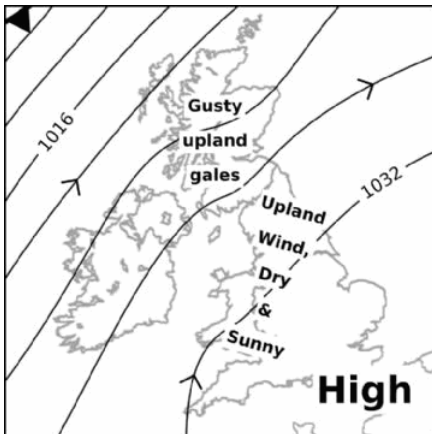
Brecon Beacons

General Summary for Thursday, 16 January, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 16 January, 2025

Almost all mountains cloud free but low level fog coming in off the south and west coasts and rolling up some coastal uplands and mountains. Many summits warmer than their mid-slopes. Sudden increase of wind with height; very gusty gales in the Highlands. Hazy low down in some areas; superb visibility from high ground.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Dry and sunny with a cool upland breeze

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 16 January, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 15 to 20mph. Strongest west Wales in the afternoon; may reach 25mph Cambrian range.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Moving in to the Brecon Beacons in the afternoon; summits remaining clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	Clear start with some valley fog to the south of Bannau Brycheiniog/Brecon Beacons NP. Cloud will increasingly move in from the south in the afternoon, enveloping the lower southern slopes and gradually rising to 600m. Higher summits staying out of cloud. Very little cloud expected in mid-Wales. 90% dropping to 70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive bright sunshine and higher up excellent visibility but haze and cloud will gradually extend northwards.
How Cold? (at 750m)	8 to 10C but marginally cooler on the mid-slopes. Feeling below 5C in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.
