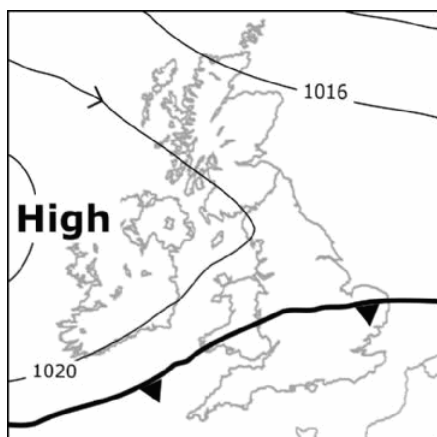

General Summary for Friday, 2 May, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 2 May, 2025

Much of upland Britain fine with light wind and for many extensive sunshine. Risk of an isolated shower Wales, and also progressively more showery northwest across the Scottish Highlands, where cloud will shroud most western summits. Very warm still in Wales.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Light wind. Patchwork of sun. Low risk shower.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 2 May, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Direction varied 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain very unlikely Very low risk isolated burst of rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sun - cloud coming and going. Visibility becoming very good, perhaps excellent as cloud gradually thins.
How Cold? (at 750m)	12 rising toward 16C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 15 to 20, but perhaps for periods 25mph Cambrian range.	Northerly 15mph, but perhaps 20mph at times Cambrian mountains.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly smal.	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little or no rain A few showers possible afternoon.	Precipitation unlikely
Cloud on the hills?	Most or all summits frequently cloud free Hills free of, or largely free of cloud.	Not expected
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun although perhaps cloudy at times. Visibility mostly excellent.	Sunshine extensive morning; cloud coming and going afternoon. Superb visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	8C, rising toward 12C.	3C rising to 8C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 3 May, 2025

High pressure in the vicinity of the British Isles will bring extensive fine weather over the next week - perhaps much longer. Winds frequently light and mountains often free of low cloud. Generally warm, although cold air over the weekend and early next week will bring summits in Scotland below freezing point and widespread frost to lowland valleys at night. Very dry conditions underfoot will extend to almost all mountain areas with fire risk becoming very significant indeed.
