

## General Summary for Tuesday, 10 June, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 10 June, 2025

A fine day developing as overnight rain fades and cloud banks lift and break to reveal patchy sunshine. Early strong breezes easing gradually. Patchy cloud may come and go on higher western tops in the Highlands. Slower to improve in south Wales.

#### **Headline for Brecon Beacons**

Strong breeze easing. Drizzly low cloud morning, improving.

### Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 10 June, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 25-30mph around dawn, or stronger just before gusts over 35mph. Soon dropping during morning to 15-20mph, then 10mph afternoon, or less later; turning south-southwesterly into night.		
Effect of wind on you?	Walking impeded at first - stability may be challenged around dawn on high tops -feeling chilly, but improving, becoming increasingly small.		
How wet?	Occasional drizzly rain morning		
(Precipitation and its impact)	Remnants of overnight rain leaves patches of drizzle during the morning, brief light showers, most frequent western areas.  Fading into middle of day to be dry for the afternoon.		
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive morning, improving afternoon		
	Widespread cloud from middle slopes up in morning, down to low slopes western hills.  Bases rise to upper slopes during morning, gradually breaking up during middle of day to leave tops increasingly clear afternoon.		
Chance of cloud free summits?	Less than 10% early, rising to 80% afternoon.		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloudy morning, misty for a few hours, improving gradually from north, leaving patchwork of sun and cloud into afternoon, visibility becoming excellent.		
How Cold? (at 750m)	10C, rising to 12C. Little change, or slight rise further after dark.		
Freezing Level	Above the summits

	Wednesday 11 June	Thursday 12 June
How windy? (On the summits)  Effect of wind on you?	Southerly 15-20mph. Gradually shifting southeasterly, rising towards a gusty 30mph or higher toward evening onward.  Fairly small, though increasingly gusty with time. Walking impeded or strenuous later with buffeting gusts.	Southeast then southerly, 25 to 40mph, risk gusts 50mph at first; speeds may ease, but gusty around heavy rain.  Very blustery, walking arduous on high terrain, affecting balance on exposed tops and ridges especially morning.
How wet?	Dry during daylight, chance rain late	Thunderstorms likely soon develop
(Precipitation and its impact)	Chance a few spots of rain may quickly come and go by evening, possibly an odd heavy burst coming up from south by dusk.	Sporadic bursts of rain from elevated cloud from dawn. Increasing threat possibly soon of widespread heavy rain developing from the south, lasting several hours, risk thunderstorms; may clear northward during afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Morning cloud breaking, clearing summits	Extensive with varied patches in rain
	High terrain often shrouded early with bases drifting well downslope in the south. Patchy breaks soon increase and cloud bases lift, leaving mostly clear tops by afternoon.	Possible clear for a time, but as rain develops, cloud filling in across the hills, in places patches from forest canopies upward during and after heavy bursts. May improve during afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Becoming 90%	50%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun becoming frequent or mostly sunny. Visibility becoming excellent.	Mainly overcast, hazy, poor visibility in rain. Some sun may break through later in the day, visibility may improve.
How Cold? (at 750m)	11C rising to 16C. Little drop in temperature, if any, into night.	15C from dawn, but then little change; small variation with height in morning.

#### **Planning Outlook**

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 11 June, 2025

Much warmer and feeling humid as winds shift southerly through Wednesday. Low pressure to the west and a front pushing in brings a risk of thunderstorms on Thursday, soonest in Wales, advancing northeastwards over England and Scotland likely afternoon into evening - some uncertainty of timing. Low pressure is likely to linger later week into weekend - initially staying warm and humid, bringing an ongoing risk of thundery downpours, mixed with sunnier spells. Likely cooler and windier with time over the weekend. Southwesterlies then prevailing with rain at times, most over western mountains into early next week, but a trend toward higher pressure building from the south with drier conditions emerging.
