








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General Summary for Saturday, 14 June, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 14 June, 2025

Varied across Britain through the day, particularly England and Wales, where some sunshine will be interspersed with rain (including thunderstorms), low cloud and changes in wind speed and direction. Changes slower in Scotland where broadly a band of thundery rain will move northwards.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Sometimes fine: windy, sometimes low cloud, risk thunderstorm.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 14 June, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	South veering southwesterly. Generally 20 or 25 but 30mph for a few hours morning	
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small.	
How wet?	Rain on and off; risk thunderstorm Areas of thundery rain before dawn will have cleared. Then a mix through the day: intermittently fine but mainly west Wales, patches of rain and drizzle, including further scattered thunderstorms.	
(Precipitation and its impact)		
Cloud on the hills?	Very extensive, particularly west Wales	
Chance of cloud	Persistent fog across the mountains post dawn; the fog sometimes from just above the valleys. Will improve at times; by afternoon cloud frequently confined to highest summits east Wales, but still frequently 500m Cambrian range - and sometimes 300m SW Wales. 50%

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sunshine, mainly east and mid Wales afternoon. Visibility very good but in SW Wales very hazy.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	12C

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Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 15 June	Monday 16 June
How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly, varying between 15 and perhaps 25mph.	Between southwest and west; 15 or 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small	Small
How wet?	Drizzly rain, mainly toward coast	Rain unlikely
(Precipitation and its impact)	Risk occasional drizzly rain western mountains. Total rainfall small. Elsewhere, drizzly showers, if any, rare.	Possibly pockets fine drizzle slopes close to southwest facing coasts.
Cloud on the hills?	May not clear higher summits all day; lowest cloud toward west coast	Persistent near some coasts; cloud base rising to or above higher tops
	Preseli and Cambrian range: cloud base varied, sometimes 300m most often 500 or 600m - but may clear for a few hours middle of day. Elsewhere; cloud base will tend to rise, by afternoon mostly above 650m, perhaps braking above the summits in east Wales.	SW Wales: Hills may be foggy most or all day, particularly Preseli, where cloud may be below 200 or 300m (and form on coastal cliffs) Elsewhere: cloud base rising to or above higher summits.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50%	90% afternoon
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sun mainly east Wales. Frequently very good or excellent visibility, but perhaps sometimes misty near the coast.	Patchwork of, or extensive sunshine and very good visibility - but perhaps dull and sometimes misty toward the coast SW Wales.
How Cold? (at 750m)	11C	13 to 17C warmest east Wales afternoon.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 15 June, 2025

Colder air from the west will reach all areas by Sunday. However, low cloud still extensive on western mountains, together with drizzly showers. Little rainfall most of next week and increasingly warm, although western Scotland colder with occasional rain as weakening fronts affect particularly the NW Highlands. By mid week it should be fine everywhere - although it may not last into the following weekend.
