

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# General Summary for Monday, 30 June, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 30 June, 2025

Very warm and humid. Gale force southerly winds for NW Scotland at first will ease, but gusty winds strengthen elsewhere. As a front encroaches from the west across the Highlands, bursts of rain will merge into a swathe of more extensive heavy rain, possible thunder. Dry with sunshine for England and Wales, small risk local showers.

#### **Headline for Brecon Beacons**

Very warm; sunny, some coastal mist. Moderate breeze.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 30 June, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 15 to 25mph, strongest in west, becoming gustier through afternoon.	
Effect of wind on you?	Starting to affect comfortable walking, particularly later.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Very likely dry  Some fine drizzle possible near coast if in cloud early morning.  Most likely all day dry, but during afternoon, small chance of a very isolated burst of rain toward east mid-Wales.	
Cloud on the hills?  Chance of cloud free summits?	Little or none away from coastal slopes  The mountains clear apart from brief early patches.  Very low cloud / fog near to the coast in west particularly morning, tending to thin and break up, but patches may linger.  90%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and some thin high cloud. Visibility very good, but some early haze or mist, which may linger near Pembrokeshire coast.	
How Cold? (at 750m)  Freezing Level	16C where in cloud, up to 20C particularly eastern areas; very humid.  Starting to drop into the night.  Above the summits

### **Planning Outlook**

### All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 1 July, 2025

Cooler across Scotland by Monday night as a cold front advances eastwards. Risk of scattered thundery showers Tuesday-Wednesday, mostly eastern areas. High pressure then builds to the south, whilst a humid southwesterly returns to bring spells of rain and low cloud to western Scotland. The second week of July looks cooler for all with sunshine and showers.
