

Brecon Beacons

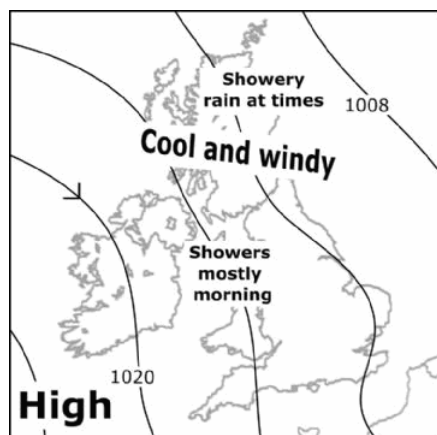

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General Summary for Monday, 7 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 7 July, 2025

Northwesterly winds will be blustery over the mountains, feeling distinctly chilly in exposure. Plenty of dry weather, some showers toward the north and east of Scotland. Showery rain for Wales early in the day fades. Cloud clearing many tops and some sun.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Windy and cool. Some showers, then broken cloud and sun.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 7 July, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly 25-35mph, up to 40mph at dawn. Becoming gusty into evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking impeded in strongest wind, buffeting gusts may challenge stability. Feeling cool.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Morning showers fade A few showers drift onto western slopes and the Cambrians, risk of some showery bursts moving east in the morning. Fading for a dry afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Tops soon cloud-free Banks drift over high tops on western mountains, notably the Cambrians. Lifting through morning to clear the tops, only fleeting caps over highest tops remain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sun becoming fairly extensive. Very good visibility through some haze.
How Cold? (at 750m)	7C rising to 10C, locally warmer on easternmost hills. Feeling like 3C in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 8 July	Wednesday 9 July
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Northerly 20-25mph at dawn, easing to a northwesterly 15mph, but then increasingly gusty later in the day. Fairly small much of the day.	West to northwesterly 10 to 20mph. Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain unlikely Fine drizzle possible on western slopes in low cloud in morning.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills cloud-free after morning Patchy cloud drifts around high tops early, lifting through morning and clearing summits.	Early low cloud, largely clearing Banks of cloud particularly western hills, may cover Cambrians and Preseli hills to 400m or lower in morning. Lifting and breaking up to leave most or all hills clear into afternoon. Some fog near coast.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90% most of the day	30% rising to 80% afternoon.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive morning sunshine, high cloud gradually building through afternoon. Excellent visibility.	Fairly cloudy morning, occasional sun into middle of day, increasingly sunnier. Misty coastal hills particularly in morning; visibility becoming very good.
How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level	8C rising to 11C, up to 13C easternmost hills. Above the summits	13C rising to 16C, humid. Above the summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 8 July, 2025**

Low pressure to the northwest maintains a humid southwesterly wind mid-late this week, with fronts situated near northwestern coasts - often extensive low cloud here with some drizzly rain. Drier with sun and broken cloud in east and southern Scotland. High pressure expanding over England and Wales brings more sunshine and draws in increasingly very warm air again in the later part of this week, higher temperatures extending into Scotland with time; some mist may continue to affect coasts in the west.
