

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General Summary for Tuesday, 8 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 8 July, 2025

A bright and sunny morning particularly in the east, then thickening cloud will lower across Scottish mountains from the west, with rain and drizzle developing, persistent in west; wind also increasing. England & Wales sees sunshine then high cloud, lowering onto tops by evening with a little rain arriving.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Breezy early morning and later. Sunshine and high cloud.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 8 July, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 20-25mph at dawn, easing to a northwesterly 15mph, but then increasingly gusty later in the day.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small much of the day.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	
Cloud on the hills?	Hills cloud-free	
	Fragments of cloud drifts around high tops early, lifting through morning and clearing summits.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90% most of the day	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive morning sunshine, high cloud gradually building through afternoon. Excellent visibility.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	8C rising to 11C, up to 13C easternmost hills.

Cloud on the hills?	Early low cloud, largely clearing	Hills clear
	Banks of cloud particularly western hills, may cover Cambrians and Preseli hills to 400m or lower in morning. Lifting and breaking up to leave most or all hills clear into afternoon. Some fog near coast.	Any early patchy mist or cloud around slopes soon dispersing.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30% rising to 80% afternoon.	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy morning, occasional sun into middle of day, increasingly sunnier. Misty coastal hills particularly in morning; visibility becoming very good.	Mostly sunny. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	13C rising to 16C, humid.	14C rising to 18C.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 9 July, 2025

A humid southwesterly wind during midweek produces extensive low cloud across west and northwest Scotland with some drizzly rain. Drier with sun and broken cloud in eastern Scotland, improving in southern areas. High pressure expanding over England and Wales brings more sunshine and draws in increasingly very warm air again in the later part of this week; higher temperatures and more sunshine extending into Scotland with time. A fine and very warm weekend in prospect, low risk of thundery showers forming toward the west. Cooler with a greater risk of showers early next week.
