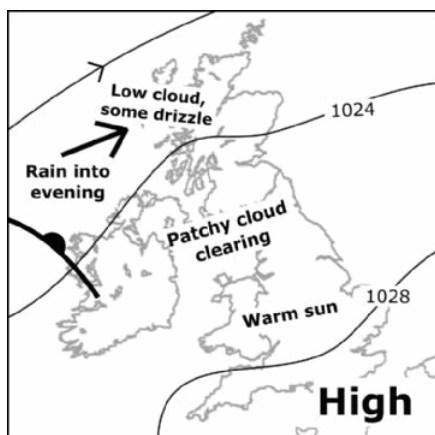

General Summary for Sunday, 10 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 August, 2025

Dry for most places all day, but the west coast of Scotland is likely to hold onto low cloud and some drizzle, mainly around Skye. More persistent rain develops into the evening in western Scotland. Elsewhere, cloud banks lifting above most summits, some sunshine. A fresh southwesterly breeze, increasing later.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Moderate breeze. Dry and warm, hills clearing.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 10 August, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest then southerly 5 to 10mph, at times 15mph Cambrians.
Effect of wind on you?	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Local patches clearing Varied banks of cloud around some slopes, fairly widely in west Wales from dawn, some high tops may start near top of cloud layer, but then lifting to cap hill tops for a few hours, breaking above most hills midday into afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50% rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of cloud and sun. Visibility increasingly very good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	10C rising to 14C afternoon, rising slightly higher evening onward.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 11 August, 2025

A front moves affects Scotland into Monday with rain, drizzle and low cloud, also damp and misty at least on Monday morning for the Lakes. Very warm and humid over England and Wales in the first half of the week, but this comes with a risk of thundery bursts of rain drifting northeastwards. Warm and humid air briefly extends across Scotland through Monday and particularly Tuesday. Wednesday onward, southwesterlies prevail in Scotland, low cloud often covering western hills, but small amounts of rain. Higher pressure further south, staying mostly dry and warm England, Wales & S/E Scotland.

Forecasts are issued daily by 16:30 and are kept under review and amended as necessary. However, expected conditions can still change after issue. © Copyright Mountain Weather Information Service, 2025.
