

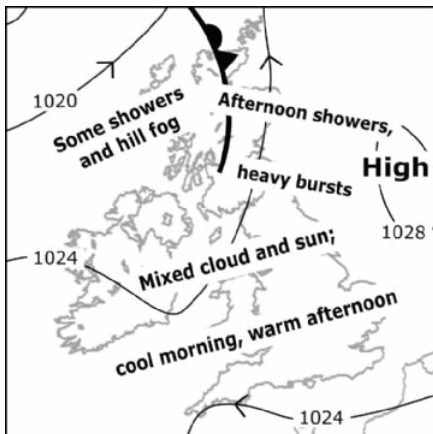
# Brecon Beacons

## General Summary for Sunday, 26 April, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 26 April, 2026**

Showers in Scotland spread east, turning heavy afternoon. Fog lowering to high terrain in the west Highlands, becoming cooler here. Patchy dawn mist England and Wales, a broader low layer of sea fog east of the Pennines, lifting for clear hills; risk of a few late showers in north England. A cool start, becoming mild.

### Headline for Brecon Beacons

Warm with a mix of cloud and sun; small chance of showers east

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 26 April, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South-southwesterly 10-15mph, up to 20mph early in the day. Trending variable in direction and towards lower speeds, perhaps a lull by evening.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small, through a notable breeze in the morning, some gustiness too (not just on high terrain).</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Likely dry</b> Local showers here and there, the showers generally light and fleeting and concentrated to the Cambrians/mid-Wales. The Brecon Beacons likely stay entirely dry.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Likely cloud-free</b> Patchy mist in eastern valleys, this soon dissipating after sunrise for cloud-free hills.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny, though weakened by high cloud, which may thicken at times. Very good visibility, some early haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	10 or 11C, may rise a degree. Starting several degrees cooler in the valleys, rising to 17C, locally 19C valleys near Black Mountains.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Monday 27 April	Tuesday 28 April
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Northerly 10-15mph; may shift northeasterly afternoon, notable gusts to 20mph. <b>Fairly small, though some inconvenient gusts over high terrain at times.</b>	Northeasterly 15-25mph. Notable gusts, not just on high exposed terrain. <b>Fairly small, gusts may begin to impede walking.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Chance scattered showers, mostly dry</b> Scattered showers here and there, greatest risk over eastern hills.	<b>Scattered showers</b> Occasional showers, mostly light, and largely in east Wales. A few showers may drift further west.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Soon mostly clear</b>  Banks of cloud at various elevations from dawn, lifting to mostly 800-900m and up through morning and likely breaking off the summits. Some risk of caps returning to high tops if afternoon showers occur.  <b>Rising to 80%</b>	<b>Soon clear</b>  A layer of cloud above 600m early, most extensive eastern hills, this lifting through morning, likely clearing the summits by midday. Small chance a few odd banks drifting over highest eastern summits.  <b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny until afternoon, then a patchwork of cloud and sun. Good visibility, but a lingering haze.	A patchwork of cloud and sun, best chance of extended sun breaks west. Excellent visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	8 to 10C.  Above the summits.	5 to 8C.  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 27 April, 2026

Monday is likely showery, risk heavy with lightning in England. An easterly wind then gradually establishes in England and Wales, chilly nights and mornings with patchy dawn mist and light frosts, this soon fading for warm days. High pressure remains dominant through the week: regularly sunny and pleasantly warm days; summit temperatures often at or above 10C, many valleys will warm toward 20C or higher afternoon. Risk of sunburn in strong sunshine and very dry springtime ground conditions with high risk of wildfire.

Detail becomes uncertain into next weekend, but a rising risk of showers and longer spells of rain, mostly England and Wales, and likely turning cooler into the following week as wind shifts northerly.
