

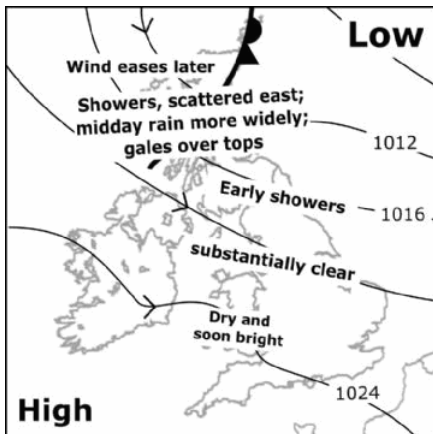
# Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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## General Summary for Saturday, 13 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:**  
**Based on forecast chart for noon 13 June, 2026**

Chilly and showery west Scottish highlands, fewer showers east but several afternoon hours of more widespread rain, later easing. Some early showers from south Scotland to north Wales, largely fading with sun breaks; south Wales is dry and brighter. Strong wind widely, easing Wales and north Scotland.

An early breeze; dry, becoming sunny and warm

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 13 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northwesterly 20-25mph, some stronger gusts over tops early and likely strongest wind east. A gradual easing trend, 15mph most hills later and locally less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small, but quite blustery in exposure in the early hours, particularly east.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Precipitation not expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Early cloud breaks up</b> Ragged patches at various heights at dawn, some thicker banks most likely on northern slopes, and probably capping most tops. Cloud lifts and breaks up through morning for clear hills by midday.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Rising to 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Sun increasingly breaking out, a mostly sunny afternoon likely with some high cloud around. Very good visibility though some haze towards coasts.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	9 or 10C, rising to 13 or 14C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 14 June	Monday 15 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Northwesterly 15mph at dawn, gusting 20 over high tops, easing and becoming variable, 10mph or less.  <b>Small.</b>	Low confidence: generally southerly 15-20mph, some risk stronger over high tops, and also chance of a morning lull.  <b>Probably fairly small, but a risk of stronger breezes impeding walking on high terrain.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain expected</b>	<b>Showery rain, drier afternoon</b>  Showery rain through the morning, may set in for a few hours and a risk of some heavier falls. Rain clears away to the north and east through afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>   <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Probably clearing hills</b>  Some patchy mist in sheltered valleys at dawn, some variable ribbons of cloud from middle northern slopes upward as well; many areas start clear. Cloud lifts through morning, mostly dissipating too, for cloud-free hills.  <b>Rising to 90%</b>	<b>Variable banks early, clear afternoon</b>  Patchy banks of cloud early at various heights, mostly southern slopes and many clear areas too. Bases lift to largely high terrain, banks may persist for a time near rain, likely dissipating afternoon for clear hills.  <b>Rising to 80% afternoon</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun increasingly breaks out but may be weakened by high cloud. Very good visibility.	Some weak sun through high cloud at times. Good visibility, though reduced in morning rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	11C, but may start warmer on southwest slopes. Rising to 15 or 16C.  Above the summits.	12 or 13C, rising up to 15C eastern hills, may be cooler west.  Well above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 14 June, 2026

Sunday will be a clearing day for most under a core of high pressure: early rain in Scottish Highlands easing, most cloud lifting off all hills except the north of Scotland, and good sunshine through weakened by high cloud. Temperature more widely mild, warm in Wales. Into next week, a mixed southwesterly pattern remains, windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. Warmest in England and Wales, but may stay cooler in Scotland as low pressure to the northwest recycles air from the north Atlantic back onto the Munros. Tuesday into Wednesday shows indications of a wetter and windier spell. Pressure generally trending higher later in the week, but extensively settled weather remains elusive until at least the following week.
