

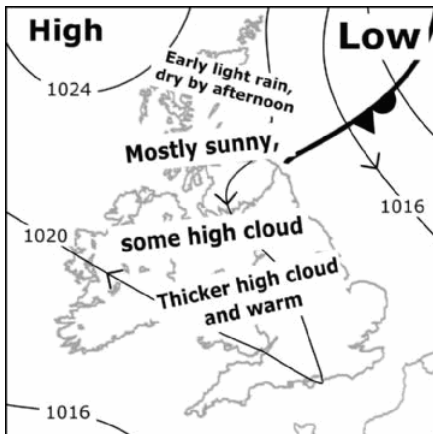
# Brecon Beacons

## General Summary for Sunday, 14 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 14 June, 2026

Some early drizzle and patchy light rain in northern Scotland fades by afternoon. Elsewhere dry all day and often sunny though some high cloud weakening sun in places; sun may be more patchy east Scotland and later northern England. Warm southern Pennines and Wales. Light wind, though starting blustery in east Scotland.

### Headline for Brecon Beacons

Weak sun through high cloud, occasional thicker cloud, warm

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 14 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northwesterly 15mph, gusting 20 over high tops at dawn, rapidly easing and becoming variable, 10mph or less through afternoon.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>No rain expected during daytime</b> Into nighttime, a rising risk of a band of rain forming.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Likely entirely clear</b> Some patchy mist in sheltered valleys at dawn, some variable ribbons of cloud from middle northern slopes upward as well; most areas start clear. Any early cloud soon dissipates for cloud-free hills later morning.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Rising to 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun increasingly breaks out but may be weakened by high cloud. Good visibility but a haze to the southwest.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	11C, but may start warmer on southwest slopes. Rising to 14C, or perhaps 15C southwestern slopes.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Monday 15 June	Tuesday 16 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	South-southeasterly 15-25mph most of the day, though may be stronger early, approaching 30-35mph over tops. <b>Blustery over the tops early with strenuous walking; effect easing, but ease of walking often affected.</b>	Southwesterly 10-20mph at dawn, strengthening to 30-35mph afternoon, sometimes 40mph high tops. <b>Fairly small at dawn, deteriorating to strenuous walking, strongest wind challenging stability with wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Some patchy rain</b> A band of rain affects the hills for a few early hours, this soon passing to the northeast for a largely dry day; a small risk of some patchy falls afternoon.	<b>Patchy rain, later setting in</b> Patchy rain drifts from the southwest from morning, plenty of dry windows, but rain increasingly frequent afternoon, probably setting in persistently for several hours, heavy falls south and west slopes.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Variable banks early, clear afternoon</b>  Patchy banks of cloud early at various heights, mostly southern slopes and many clear areas too. Bases lift to largely high terrain, banks may persist for a time near rain, likely dissipating afternoon for clear hills.	<b>Fairly extensive, some early breaks</b>  High terrain shrouded from dawn, likely 500-600m upward; some morning periods of higher bases, any breaks to summits brief. Then more extensively shrouded afternoon from 400m up, higher bases east of Brecon.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Rising to 80% afternoon</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Some weak sun through high cloud at times, perhaps briefly more sunny. Good visibility, though reduced in morning rain.	Mostly overcast, rare glimpses of weak sun early. Very good visibility below cloud, deteriorating later in rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b> <b>Freezing Level</b>	12 or 13C, rising up to 15C many hills but some local variability throughout the day by a few degrees. Well above the summits.	11 to 13C, mildest east. Feeling like +1 to 3C in strongest wind.  Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 15 June, 2026**

Through Monday, cloud will return from the southwest and bring some patchy rain with it. From Tuesday onward, a variable southwesterly will dominate through at least mid-week. Windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west; Tuesday into Wednesday is likely a wetter and unsettled period, with the unsettled weather lingering well into Wednesday in Scotland. Warmest in England and Wales, but may stay cooler in Scotland as low pressure to the northwest recycles air from the north Atlantic back onto the Munros. Pressure generally trending higher later in the week, centred southeast of England, but low pressure to the west of Ireland will prevent any extended settled periods with more windy, wet weather at times next weekend; temperatures likely become more widely warm.
