

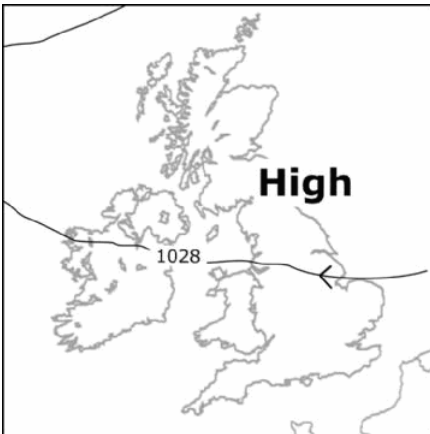
# Brecon Beacons

## General Summary for Sunday, 21 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:**  
**Based on forecast chart for noon 21 June, 2026**

Extensive bright sunshine - beware of sunburn and dehydration - and light wind. Cloud and a few brief showers NW Highlands will move away north, whilst along the Pennines and later Cumbria and S Scotland, patchy cloud and an isolated shower will form.

**Headline for Brecon Beacons**

Light wind; bright sunshine and very clear air.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 21 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Easterly, 10mph or less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Negligible.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	Rain not expected
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	Hills clear
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	Above 90%
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Periods of sunshine weakened or giving way at times by areas of high cloud. Visibility excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	13C at dawn, rising to 20C afternoon. Feeling humid.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South to southeasterly between 15 and perhaps 25mph.	Southwesterly 15 to perhaps 25mph,.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Fairly small</b>	<b>Fairly small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Risk thunderstorm</b> Confidence low: it may remain dry. But risk of a few bursts of rain, perhaps brief although from afternoon chance scattered thunderstorms.	<b>Rain very unlikely</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Very little for most of the day - may form in rain.</b> Generally the hills free of cloud although fog may form on higher slopes in rain.	<b>Little if any</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>	<b>Soon almost certain</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine although sometimes through thin high level cloud. Visibility good, although a haze.	Sunshine extensive, sometimes weak due to thin high level cloud. Good visibility although hazy.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	21C - very warm and also very humid indeed.	19C rising to a very warm (and exceptionally humid) 24C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 22 June, 2026**

Extensively dry, very warm but very humid indeed England and Wales, although around Monday chance of a thunderstorm. Rain and low cloud at times Scotland, mainly affecting western mountains - although later next week the warmth encroaching into Scotland. There may well be widespread thunderstorms later in the week, before less hot weather extends from the Atlantic around next weekend.
