

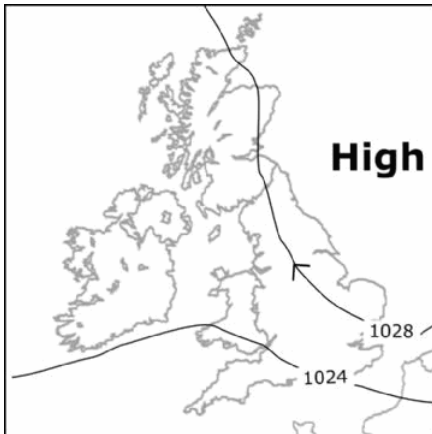
# Brecon Beacons

## General Summary for Monday, 22 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:**  
**Based on forecast chart for noon 22 June, 2026**

Although high pressure will dominate - bringing high temperatures and sunshine to Wales and most of England, in the far north and across Scotland, high level cloud may bring rain for an hour or two, this leading to formation of low cloud that may be very slow to lift.

### Headline for Brecon Beacons

Light wind; small chance of thunderstorm. Sunshine; very warm & humid.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 22 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South to southeasterly between 10 to 15mph - local sudden gusts to 30mph near a thunderstorm.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly negligible</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Risk of the odd shower or thunderstorm but extensively dry</b> Dry. most or all day Remote risk later afternoon of heavy rain in an isolated thunderstorm.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Very little for most of the day - may form in rain.</b> Generally the hills free of cloud although fog possible temporarily on higher slopes in rain.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Greater than 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine. Visibility good, although a haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	18 rising to 24C - very warm and also very humid indeed.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly 15 to perhaps 25mph late in day,.	Direction may well vary, 10mph or less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly negligible</b>	<b>Negligible</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain very unlikely</b>	<b>Rain not expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little if any</b>	<b>Little if any</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Soon almost certain</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine extensive, sometimes weak due to thin high level cloud. Good visibility although hazy.	Extensive sunshine. Persistent haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	19C rising to a very warm (and exceptionally humid) 24C.	23C rising toward an exceptionally hot 25 to perhaps 28C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 23 June, 2026**

A few days of often sunny and very warm weather. Some doubt remains about daytime temperatures - these possibly exceptionally hot on Wednesday (England and Wales) and Thursday (everywhere). The range in mountain temperatures given on Wednesday's forecasts reflects the uncertainty. Gradually less hot Friday and into the weekend; the change accompanied by thunderstorms in some areas.
