

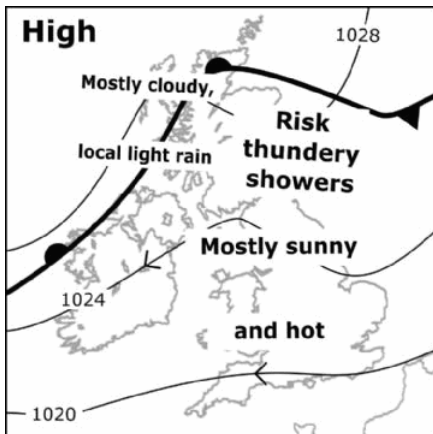
Brecon Beacons

General Summary for Saturday, 11 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2026

Fairly cloudy Scottish highlands, drizzly tops east where a risk of thundery showers; drier west, local bright breaks. A rising risk of heavy/thundery showers forming over Southern Uplands. Very warm and sunny in England, but high cloud and a risk of showers far north later. Extensive hot sunshine for Wales.

| How windy? (On the summits) | Northeasterly 10-15mph. Occasional stronger breezes over the tops at times and beginning to strengthen late in the day. |
| Effect of wind on you? | Small. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | No rain expected |

| Chance of cloud free summits? | Nearly certain |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Extensive sunshine, patchy fair weather cloud around in the morning and afternoon. A slight haze early, visibility improving to very good. |
| How Cold? (at 750m) | 19 or 20C, rising to 24 or 25C, warmest on south slopes (many valleys up to 30C, locally 32C easternmost areas). |
| Freezing Level | Above the summits. |
