

Brecon Beacons

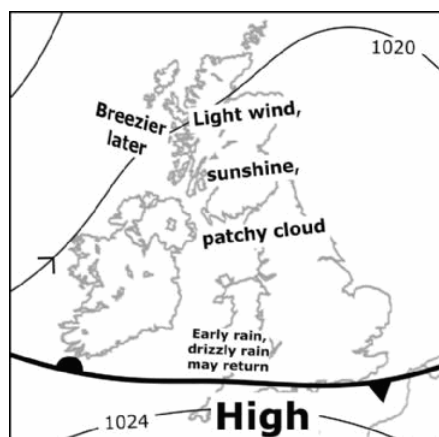
Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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General Summary for Sunday, 13 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 September, 2026

A fine day for most places with light winds. Varied cloud around some hill slopes early in the day tending to lift and break, sunny spells. Risk of more cloud lingering over hills in Wales, some rain and drizzle in the south as a front stays nearby. Southwesterly breezes increase later western Scotland.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Low cloud, drizzly rain south, tending to improve; moderate breeze.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 13 September, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 20-25mph at dawn, easing a little to 15-20mph strongest toward south, then tending to rise again later in day to 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Feeling chilly in a fresh breeze particularly early morning, becoming fairly small for a time, but likely feeling breezier again later.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Early rain clears, some drizzly rain may linger in south Very wet underfoot from heavy overnight rain, fast-flowing streams and surface water. Remnants of rain likely continue into early morning but clearing southeastward. Some drizzle may come and go on southern hills, locally risk more persistent for periods southernmost areas, but substantially dry toward mid-Wales.
Cloud on the hills?	Covering hills widely early in day, slow to lift and break in south Low cloud fairly extensive from dawn, to some lower slopes in south and western areas. May linger for several hours over southern hills, the base tending to rise to 600-700m, then breaks emerging gradually, soonest on eastern hills. By evening, low cloud likely to roll back in from the southwest to become extensive again.
Chance of cloud free summits?	10% rising to 60% into afternoon, lowering again evening onward.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy, some glimpses of sun mostly eastern mid-Wales, may brighten up a little more widely with time. Murky at first, visibility stays poor around drizzle and low cloud, but tending to become good many places.
How Cold? (at 750m)	12C, little change all day and night, slightly warmer in east afternoon; quite humid. Feeling like 5C in early wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 14 September, 2026

Staying unsettled during the next week to 10 days as westerlies prevail - areas of low pressure passing north of Scotland with frontal systems bringing frequent rain, wettest over western mountains in Scotland. Often windy, gale-force westerly winds for periods over higher terrain. Fairly warm and humid on Monday, then on the cooler side for several days, with considerable wind chill on the mountains. Higher pressure and better weather tends to expand further north later in month.

Forecasts are issued daily by 16:30 and are kept under review and amended as necessary. However, expected conditions can still change after issue. © Copyright Mountain Weather Information Service, 2026.
