

# General Summary for Sunday, 3 August, 2025



## **British Mountain Summary:**

# Based on forecast chart for noon 3 August, 2025

Rain, low cloud and fog ahead of a front will clear Scotland late morning and England and Wales afternoon - but high humidity may maintain a little drizzle and low cloud Wales (most likely SW). Cloud base may not rise sufficiently to clear higher mountains mainly in W Scotland.

## **Headline for Cairngorms NP and Monadhliath**

Improving: wind easing; rain clearing to the odd shower, low cloud clearing.

# **Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 3 August, 2025**
